

Bill Of Congress One Hope To Keep Children In U.S.

PORTLAND (U) — A congressional bill is Mrs. Caroline Venegas' principal hope now of keeping her two older daughters with her in Salem.

An Immigration Service officer Thursday upheld the government charge that the two youngsters, because they were born in Mexico, were aliens and should be deported.

Mrs. Venegas, who has lived all her life in Salem except for the four-year period she was in Mexico when the girls were born, appealed

to the Immigration Service to delay deportation until at least Aug. 10.

She said a bill to give the girls status as permanent residents has passed the Senate, and the delay would give the House time to pass the bill.

Mrs. Venegas, 27, and a junior at Willamette University, said she met Rafael Venegas when he was a cannery worker in Salem in 1944. She went to Mexico and was married to him the following year.

They separated in 1949 after the

birth of Maria Elena, 8, and Sarah Lucia, 6. She brought the girls into the U. S. on visitors' permits.

Three months after her return to Salem, a third daughter, Anna, was born. Her place of birth automatically made her a U. S. citizen. Last year Mrs. Venegas obtained a divorce, getting custody of the children.

Now Women Can't Live Off Prostitutes' Money

SALEM (U) — The House has taken action to make it illegal for women to live off the earnings of prostitutes.

The State Supreme Court, in holding that the present law applies only to men, recently freed a Portland woman who was charged with running a house of prostitution.

The bill goes to the Senate. In explaining the bill, Rep. George Layman, Newberg, said: "We recently voted for an equal pay for women bill, which gave women equal rights in employment. This bill gives women equal responsibility with men."

Jury Acquits Family Of Killing Father

MARYSVILLE, Tenn. (U) — A mother and her three children who admitted beating their husband and father to death when he threatened to take them "all to hell together" were acquitted of murder here.

An all-male jury freed Mrs. Grace Davis and her children after deliberating 2 hours and 40 minutes.

Mrs. Davis, 41, testified her 38-year-old husband Sam threatened to drive them all over a 100-foot cliff into a river Feb. 28.

"I knew it was him or us," she said.

She said her two younger children — Katrina, 11, and Clell, 8 — looped Katrina's belt around David's neck while she and her older daughter Shelby Jean, 14, slugged him with a monkey wrench.

MOTOR BOAT SPEEDS

SALEM (U) — The Senate passed and sent to the House Friday a bill to limit motor boats to 10 miles per hour in the Pelican Bay fishing area of Upper Klamath Lake.

Bankruptcies Said Showing Increase

PORTLAND (U) — Bankruptcies in Oregon have increased sharply since the war years but are not yet alarmingly above prewar levels, Estes Snedecor, federal referee in bankruptcy, said here.

Snedecor estimated that 90 percent of those filing were wage earners and said the amounts involved were comparatively small. There have been few large bankruptcies, he said.

U. S. district court records here show bankruptcies have risen from 216 in 1946 to 1,615 in 1954. But

Snedecor pointed out that considering the increase in Oregon's population, the 1,615 is not notably higher than the 1,094 bankruptcies filed in pre-war 1941.

Most bankruptcies, he said, arise from such factors as excess installment buying, over-extension of credit, seasonal employment, fear of garnishment and divorces.

The Oregon average is a bit higher than the national, Snedecor said, but that can be attributed to its stricter law regarding garnishments.
