## Nationalists Speed Up Plans For Civilians' Dispersal

TAIPEI, Formosa (AP) — The Chinese Nationalists Tuesday speeded up plans for dispersing nonessential civilians from Taipei amid reports the Communists might soon be able to reach the city with jet bombers.

The official Central Daily News said the Reds already had completed preparations for an attack on the offshore islands of Quemoy and Matsu across the Formosa Strait.

Only Monday Mme. Chiang Kai-shek said her husband, the Nationalist president, was inflexible determined to defend those islands with or without outside help.

Against this background important American and Nationalist officials Tuesday continued their conference on mutual defense problems.

An unverified Nationalist press report said one-eyed Communist Gen. Liu Lo-Cheng, commander of the Second Field Army, had arrived April 12 at Fochow, capital of Fukien Province, about 40 miles west of the Matsu islands.

It connected his alleged arrival with Red plans for an attack on Matsu and Quemoy.

Nationalist intelligence reports said a number of Soviet-built IL28 jet bombers had arrived in Central China and speculated that they would be transferred to five jet bases in Fukien Province as soon as they are ready for use.

Generalissimo Chiang Tuesday received C. K. Yen, the governor of Formosa who heads this island's civil air defense command.

Yen's office issued fresh warnings of the possibility of Communist air attacks and urged everyone who could to move to the countryside. It urged people to build private shelters, dig wells for alternate sources of water, and move inflammable goods out of cities. It made plans to build more public shelters.

**Northwest Farmers Get \$3 Million In Loans**

SPOKANE (AP) — The Federal Land Bank of Spokane said Tuesday it loaned Northwest farmers and ranchers \$3,151,600 in March, the largest volume in any one month since 1934.

President Henry Matthew said the bank had \$95,169,232 in loans and contracts on its books on March 31, 1955 and that capital stock was \$5,467,792.

Washington farmers and ranchers borrowed \$4,339,900 during the nine-month period ended March 31, 1955. Idaho borrowers accounted for \$5,832,600, Montana \$4,498,000 and Oregon \$3,670,900.

## Business Over Nation Puts On Added Burst Of Speed Indicating Record Smasher

NEW YORK (AP) — Business, boiling along since January at its hottest pace in two years, put on an extra burst of speed last week. Indications were that activity in the second quarter, just beginning to take shape, would smash all records.

This was the situation: Gross national product in January-February-March was at an annual rate of 369 billion dollars, making it the biggest first quarter American business ever had. Only the second quarter of 1953, when gross national product hit an annual rate of 371 1/2 billions, was higher.

Gross national product is the sum total of all business activity—the combined dollar volume of all goods and services produced and sold.

Activity in key lines was faster than at the end of the first quarter than at the start. Since then it has gained further momentum, and many economists figure it will pick up added speed from now through June. That should put this year's second quarter ahead of the record April-June period of 1953, making it the biggest ever. This week you could see new evidence of the upturn almost everywhere.

Steel production was booming at 95 per cent of the industry's recently enlarged capacity. Detroit was turning out new automobiles at the rate of 28,000 a day; the industry's combined output of cars and trucks for the week — 206,458 — was the highest yet recorded. Second quarter production of cars was scheduled at 2,200,000.

Construction, already booming as never before, was headed for new peaks. F.W. Dodge Corp. said dollar volume of construction contracts awarded in March was the highest ever for that month and a sweeping 40 per cent ahead of March last year.

Housing starts, after reaching a new first-quarter high of 295,000 were expected to set still new records between now and the end of June.

Signs of a rising business trend were reflected in the stock market, which thrust to an all-time high. The increased tempo of business also produced new symptoms of tightening credit. Led by Kansas City, most of the nation's Federal Reserve banks jacked up their discount rates. That's the rate at which member banks borrow from the Federal Reserve System.

Would firming interest rates act as a brake on business? Top monetary officials in the federal government said they didn't think so. From another corner of the capital, Commerce Secretary Sinclair Weeks said business has "a good chance of putting up the best year in our history in 1955." "The current business expansion isn't 'going too fast,'" he said, and there is no real danger of inflation.

### PERMITS CONTRACTS

SALEM (AP) — A bill to permit the State Board of Higher Education contract with other agencies to preserve materials of historical, archaeological or anthropological value was passed by the Senate Saturday and sent to the House Saturday.

The bill also prohibits any persons from destroying such materials.

## Identification Tag Specifications Told By CD Authorities

The Federal Civil Defense Administration has announced new simplified specifications for civilian identification tags, according to local CD officials.

The announcement follows an earlier appeal for states and local governments to support an immediate nationwide Civil Defense tagging program to help strengthen defenses against possible atomic or H-bomb attack with the accompanying threat of radioactive fallout.

Under the law, tagging is the responsibility of states and localities, which finance their own programs, according to Brig. Gen. J. T. Pierce, county director, and Col. Bob Dicey, Roseburg director.

In Douglas County, application blanks for manufactured tags may be obtained through grocery stores.

The tags are available at cost, 25 cents.

New specifications show tags may be of lighter construction but they are adequate for identifying wearers in an emergency, officials say. It is emphasized that the change does not make obsolete identification tags and bracelets manufactured since September 1951. Provision is made for both bracelets and the necklace type identification.

Under the new standards, the stainless steel stock on which identification information is stamped should be at least .016 inch thick. The length and width should be at least one and seven-sixteenths inches by nine-sixteenths of an inch. Lettering should be of such size as to permit 20 characters to the inch or not more than 25 to a line.

The tag should show the first name, middle initial and last name of the wearer, name of next of kin or person to be notified in emergency (with address) and wearer's religious preference: P for Protestant, C for Catholic, J for Jewish and Y for other.
