Atomic Power Won't Wipe Out Other Methods

EUGENE — Some 300 representatives of public power groups in the Pacific Northwest and Alaska Thursday heard that swift expansion of atomic energy power won't wipe out need for other forms of electric generation.

William E. Johnson, general manager of the Hanford operation, predicted that by 1980, new electric power additions will be 65 per cent atomic and 35 per cent other forms. Even 10 years from now, he said, 2 per cent of new additions can be expected to be atomic.

However, all forms of generation are going to have to expand to meet the greatly increasing demand for electric power, he added. These other forms will not be soon outmoded, he said.

He spoke to the Northwest Public Power Assn. after the Washington State PUD Assn., in a separate action, had adopted a resolution calling for early federal construction of John Day Dam on the Columbia River. The resolution said there were fewer obstacles to construction of John Day than to other proposed dams in the Northwest.

The meeting runs through Friday.

Pension Granted Man Wrongfully Sent To Prison
ST. PAUL, Minn. — A man who went through 19 years of hurt and humiliation in Minnesota prisons will within a few weeks earn the final reward of a plodding justice.

Slender Leonard Hankins of Dawson Springs, Ky., will accept the first of \$300 monthly pension checks, Minnesota's payment for the years of suffering it inflicted on an innocent man.

Hankins will accept it with gratitude, some disappointment and no bitterness.

"It's enough to live on," the 59-year-old Southerner said in a resonant drawl that carried no anger. "But I'm kind of disappointed that they couldn't have done more for me."

A bill providing Hankins with \$300 a month the rest of his life has been passed by both houses of the Minnesota Legislature. When a number of other unrelated claims are settled by a conference committee, the bill goes to the governor. Hankins' payments would be retroactive to Jan. 1.

PRIMARY DATE STAYS

SALEM — The House Elections Committee refused Wednesday to go along with the Senate's plan to change the primary election date from May to late June.

The committee voted 7-3 to leave it in May. But it did approve a provision that would have precinct committeemen elected at the general election, instead of the primary, as at present.

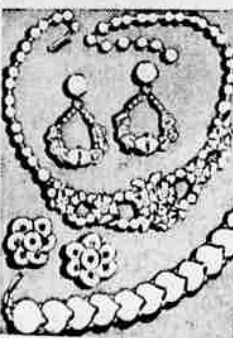

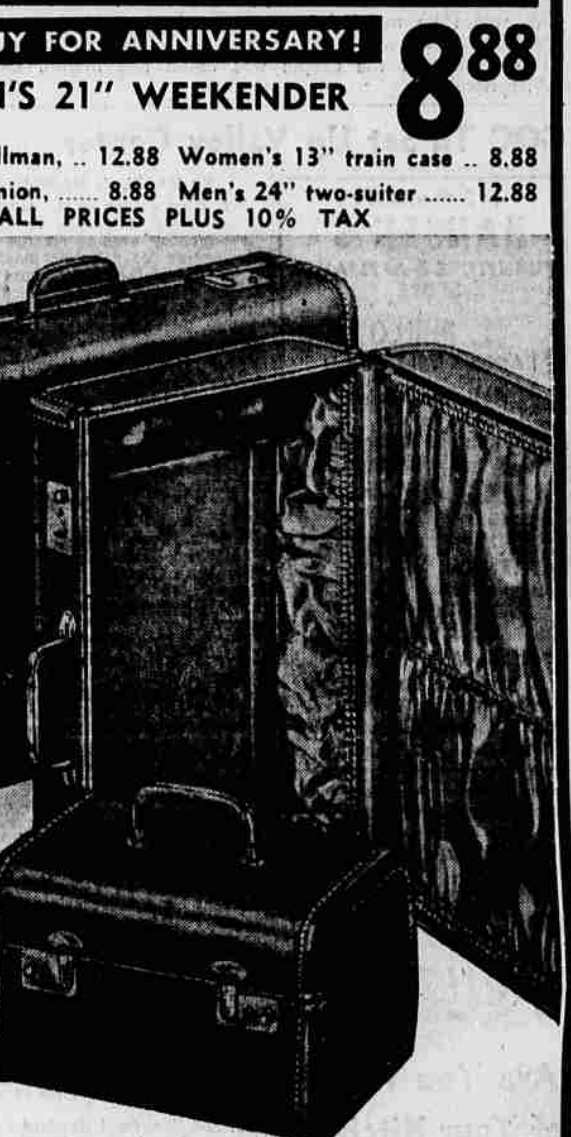
