ATHENS, Greece (AP) — Seven light tremors shook Volos during the night and early Monday morning, collapsing a number of buildings already weakened by the heavy shocks of April 19 and 21.

VATICAN CITY (AP) — The Vatican's Sacred Congregation of Rites has decided to simplify slightly the Roman Catholic mass and the breviary which priests recite daily. The change is designed to give more time for parish duties.
