

Klamath Indians To Vote On Representatives

PORTLAND (AP) — The Indian service here reported Tuesday that the Klamath tribe will vote by mail to select representatives to deal with the problem of releasing tribal assets from federal control. A three-man specialist group has been named by Interior Secretary Douglas McKay to work out the program. The election will be to name an Indian committee to confer with these men on federal action connected with the tribe's properties.

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Extension Units Plan Homemakers Festival Tuesday

The eighth annual Douglas County Homemakers Festival in Roseburg Tuesday will be tied in with the nation-wide celebration of the National Home Demonstration Week (May 1 to 7).

The Homemakers Festival for the 20 extension units of the county is scheduled to start at 10:30 a.m. in the First Methodist Church.

The two major speakers on the day-long agenda will be Dr. James Millar, director of the Good Citizenship Foundation and pastor of the Roseburg Presbyterian Church, and Mrs. Arthur Loftus, a long-time resident of Alaska.

Another top event of the day will be the second annual award of a home extension scholarship to some deserving high school senior in Douglas County. Last year's winner was Jack Couch of Milo.

Douglas County Extension Agent Helen Chandler reports the scholarship will go to a boy or girl planning to enter Oregon State College as a freshman this fall. The selection is made on the basis of financial need, scholastic ability, community and social activities.

The theme of the festival this year will be "Better Living in Douglas County." Exhibits are scheduled to show off the various projects in the county during the past year.

Luncheon is scheduled at noon at the church. Tickets may be purchased at the registration desk. The program is scheduled by the Home Extension units of the county (membership 700). Anyone interested may attend.

Legislature Seeking Welfare Enforcements

SALEM (AP) — The Oregon Legislature took action on two measures Tuesday in an effort to get better enforcement of the welfare laws.

The Senate passed 20-8 and sent to the House a bill to hire five assistant attorneys general to prosecute fraud cases. This bill was defeated 17-13 by the Senate Monday, but was reconsidered.

The House approved and sent to the Senate a resolution to create an interim committee to study welfare problems.

COMMITTEES MEET

MANILA (AP) — The eight-nation SEATO military planners' conference at Baguio broke up Tuesday into four subcommittees to draft specific projects for defending Southeast Asia from Communist aggression.

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
