Senator Morse Critical Of John Day Dam Bill

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Morse (D-Ore.) one of the principal critics of the John Day Dam partnership bill at the last session of Congress, has denounced the bill introduced at this session.

Both bills were introduced by Rep. Coon (R-Ore.). The current bill would permit local interests to put up 273 million of the dam's estimated 310 million dollar cost. The local contribution in last year's bill was set at 164 million.

Morse said the new bill "continues the principal shortcomings" of the old one, and is "vague on when the 'partners' pay."

It "apparently leaves interest rates up to agreement with the Army Engineers and Federal Power Commission, which in the last two years have been allies of the private utilities," he said.

Characterizing the bill as "the same old wolf," Morse said "they skinned a new sheep for the clothing."

1958 Target Date Set For Jet Air Transports

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Wellwood E. Beall, Boeing senior vice president, told the Airport Operators' Council conference, his company "could" start delivering jet transports in 1958.

Beall said airport managers and airlines must begin now to make definite plans for jet transports in commercial service. He said "1958 could be the year of the jet transport. This is not a contractual date, but only an estimate of when Boeing could deliver a jet transport to the airlines."

Industry leaders previously had estimated it would be 1960 before jet transports would be available commercially. Boeing's 4-jet tanker-transport prototype, the 707, made its maiden flight last summer and since then has undergone exhaustive tests.

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
