**South Umpqua State Bank Shows Business Increase**

The South Umpqua State Bank, Canyonville, has shown a healthy increase in business in the first three months of the year, comparisons of reports of condition reveal.

As of April 11, \$1,498,242.53 was in total deposits in the bank, compared to \$1,093,732.34 at the end of 1954. Loans and discounts were \$824,913.96 on April 11, increased from \$494,957.55 at the end of the year.

Total assets stood at \$1,603,123.06 at the end of the first three months compared to \$1,186,306.15 at the end of the year.

**Deputies Waiting To Talk To Mrs. Smith's Ex-Husband**

PORTLAND — Sheriff's deputies said Thursday they were waiting for a bridegroom to come home from his wedding trip to ask him about the past of Mrs. Marjorie Smith, his one-time wife.

And they were waiting, too, for a fingerprint report on Victor Lawrence Wolf, charged with Mrs. Smith in the bomb killing of her husband, attorney Keemith Smith, last week.

Mrs. Smith has protested her innocence. But Wolf has said he planted the fatal bomb in Smith's car on the urging of Mrs. Smith because, he said, he loved her.

Detectives quickly linked the blast to Wolf through similarity of wires secreted in his car to those used in connecting the bomb. Then he confessed and implicated Mrs. Smith.

Since then, Wolf's story has been checked as officials sought to forge a tight link between the killing and the widow.

Dist. Atty. William Langley said the state would try to send both Wolf and Mrs. Smith to the gas chamber.

He questioned her first husband, Merrick Hersey of Sacramento,

Calif., earlier this week and now wants to talk with her second husband, Michael Brant, who is expected back next week from a wedding trip to Mexico.

What police expected to learn from former husbands was not clear. But Holger Christoffersen, the sheriff's chief deputy, said he was waiting for a fingerprint check on Wolf to see whether he has told the truth about his past.

Wolf said he never was in trouble with the law before and Christoffersen said an FBI fingerprint report due in a day or two would confirm or disprove that.

So far, statements by Wolf that have been capable of proof locally, have checked out. Wednesday Stanley MacDonald, head of the county crime laboratory, said he had matched the ends of pussy-willows found in Mrs. Smith's home to a clump near Ridgefield, Wash. Wolf said he gathered them there while he and Mrs. Smith picnicked and plotted Smith's death.

**OSC Foresters Rank High In U. S. Exams**

For the eighth straight year, forestry seniors and graduates from Oregon State College have ranked among the top six schools in the country in the federal civil service forestry examination.

Twenty-five of the 27 OSC foresters who took the examination this year passed it for a school rating of 93 per cent. This was the third highest score among the 23 forestry schools in the country. The national average was 78 per cent.

The examination is required of men applying for technical forestry positions with the government.

In the last eight years, OSC has placed first twice—including 1954—and second twice, according to Dean W. F. McCulloch. It has never been below sixth.

**MINER DIES IN MINE**

POTTSVILLE, Pa. — The body of an independent coal miner, buried for nearly 32 hours 150 feet below the surface of a small mine near here, was recovered by rescue workers Wednesday night.

Michael Chervenak, 45, who worked the operation by himself, was trapped Tuesday morning in a cave-in. His wife and several other members of the family had kept a vigil at the mine entrance until word was received he was dead.
