PORTLAND (AP)—The Bureau of Public Roads announced award Thursday of a \$76,160 contract to Central Heating Co., Eugene, for the final link in relocation of the Willamette Highway behind Lookout Point Dam.
The firm will grade a 0.2-mile approach to a new bridge west of Oakridge, and surface and oil 2.8 miles of nearby highway.

Water Fluoridation Takes Beating In Idaho Vote

Water fluoridation took a beating at the polls in three Idaho cities Tuesday, and won at a fourth.
Caldwell residents voted 1,588 to 340 against adding fluorine to the city's water supply as a tooth decay preventive.
At Coeur d'Alene, where fluoridation has been practiced for three years, the vote was 2,475 to 997 for discontinuing it.
Wallace voters balloted 493 to 250 against fluoridation, while the proposal carried 190 to 87 at Burley.
All the fluoridation votes were advisory only.
