

Clarence Bradley Buys Parkinson's Food Store Here

Clarence J. Bradley has purchased Parkinson's Food Store, 323 W. Cass St., and was to take over management of the store today according to Thomas Parkinson.

Parkinson, who served as a state senator during five legislative sessions, said he plans to work on his farm near Winston. He and Mrs. Parkinson have one daughter, Mrs. John Killip, who lives nearby.

Parkinson has been in Roseburg 35 years and in the grocery business about 30 years. He has operated the store at its present location for 24 years, believed to be a record for this area. There is often a large turnover in location or management of food stores.

Bradley said the general policies of the store will be continued. He recently sold his grocery store on Garden Valley Road.

Bradley, active in North Roseburg Church work, has been in the grocery business most of his life, beginning in 1910 when his father and grandfather were operating a general merchandise store in Wilbur.

The Bradleys have two boys in high school, one in elementary school, and a girl who will enter school next year.

U.S. May Place Base On Formosa

WASHINGTON — The United States is considering establishing an American base on Formosa under its treaty guarantee to defend the Chinese Nationalist island against any Communist attack.

The base plan is part of a series of arrangements being developed by the State Department, Defense Department and White House which would be factors in negotiating a ceasefire and possibly an eventual settlement of the whole Formosa problem.

Further decisions on the actual steps to be taken were due to be made following the return this weekend of Asst. Secretary of State Walter Robertson and Adm. Arthur W. Radford, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. They have conferred at Taipei in the last few

days with Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek and other Chinese Nationalist officials.

Establishing an American base of jet fighter planes and Marine units, as it is presently contemplated, would have importance in several respects, officials said.

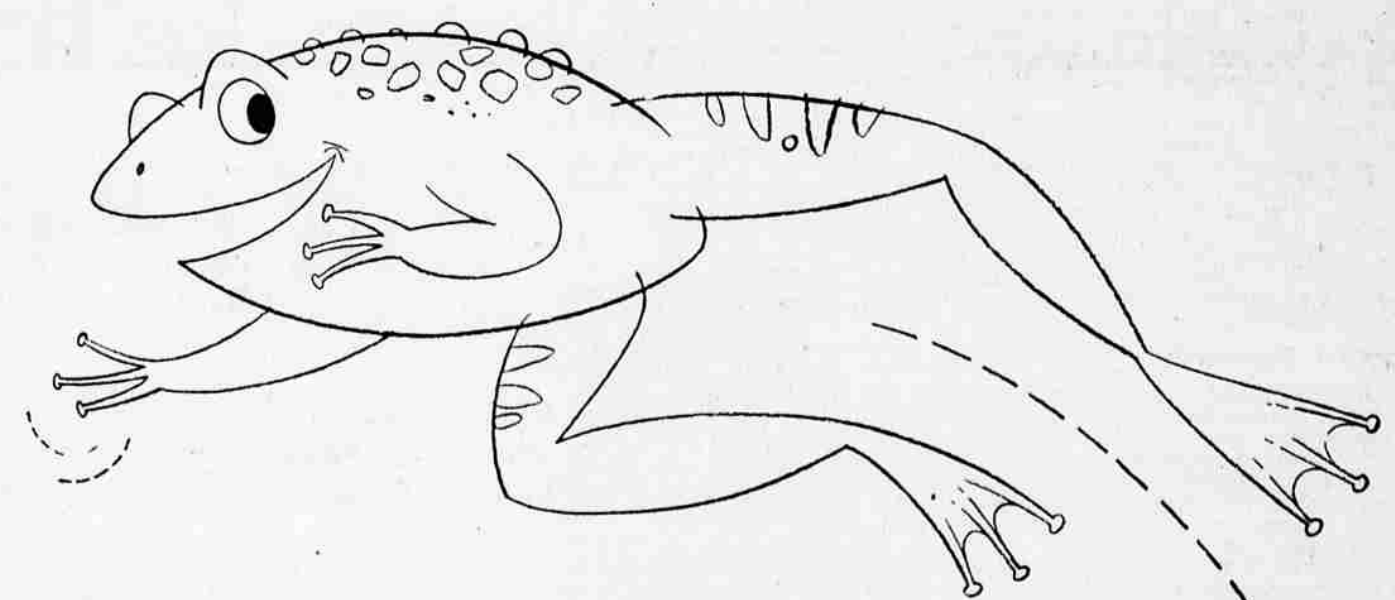

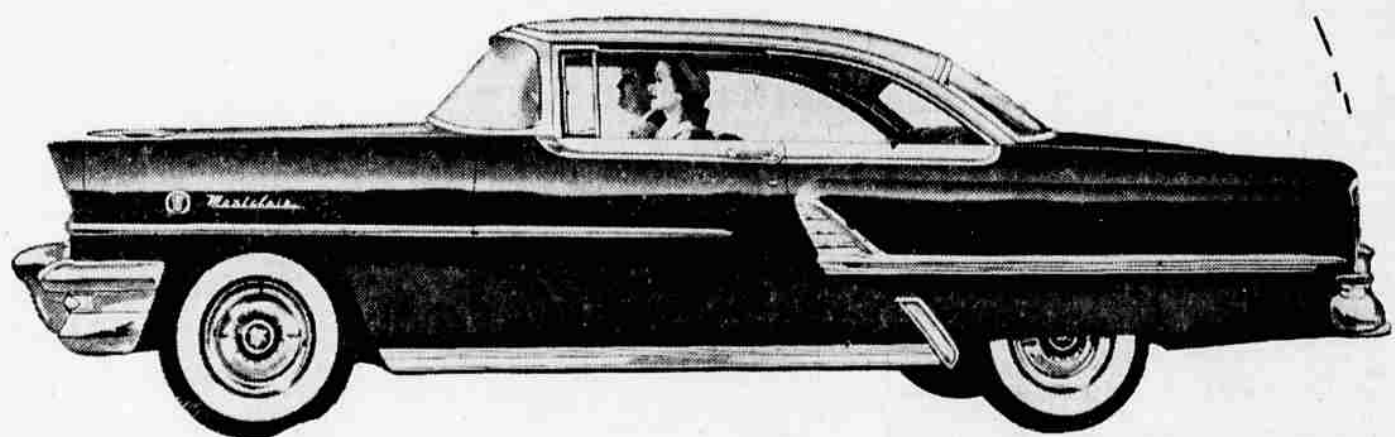
