

Racial Issue Top World's Problem, Justice Declares

NEW YORK (AP) — U.S. Supreme Court Justice William O. Douglas says the racial issue is the basic problem in the world today.

States is the best way to meet the problem he adds.

Douglas, who has traveled widely, addressed the final session Sunday of the four-day, 42nd annual meeting of the anti-defamation league of B'nai B'rith, Jewish fraternal group.

"America," he said, "has a great contribution to make to the affairs of the people throughout the world because we above all other nations have demonstrated to the world what a multi-racial nation can do."

He said that out of many races and religion represented by immigrants "we have developed one people, one language, one ideology, one flag, one patriotism, one basic loyalty."

Such integration, he added, entitles every minority group to the democratic concepts of free speech and the right to worship in its own way.

SUPPORT REQUIRED
