Planes To Attack Spruce Budworms
PORTLAND — Spray planes will attack spruce budworms on 630,000 acres of Northeastern Oregon timberlands this summer, J. Richard Stone, regional forester, said Thursday.

The federal government is providing \$652,000. This is for spraying 502,000 acres in the Ochoco, Malheur and Wallowa Whitman forests as well as a 25 per cent share of the cost of spraying 128,000 acres of intermingled and private lands. The larger share of this latter cost will come from an Oregon state appropriation of about \$99,000.

The work will be done by private contractors, Stone said, at the feeding time which is expected to be late June and early July.

Stone said that the spraying of three and a quarter million acres of forest land since the program was started in 1949, had been so successful that only 19,000 acres had to be treated a second time.
