

Roseburg Netmen Extend National Record Mark To 71

Indians Dump Eugene Team

With many previously untested players seeing action, Roseburg's powerful tennis forces collected their 71st straight dual match triumph Thursday afternoon, a 5-2 decision over Eugene, in the local cages.

Coach Al Hoffman's Indian charges won the first four singles engagements of five played and then split a pair of doubles matches.

Makes First Start
Freshman Bob Fies, making his first start, turned in an impressive 6-1, 6-1 win over Eugene's Bruce Finlayson in the number four singles match to clinch the team win for the locals.

Eugene's Jerry Wilson defeated a Roseburg sophomore, Bill Kelly, 6-3, 6-1, in the fifth singles match. The Indians also dropped the second doubles match with freshman Dick Ramberg and sophomore Brady Montgomery falling to the number two and four Eugene players.

Top Roseburg singles entry, Wayne Henninger, recouped to beat Charles Harvey 6-1, 6-1, after Wednesday's severe drubbing at Medford.

Entries from Roseburg, Marshfield and North Bend compete here Saturday for district tennis championships and berths in the state net tournament with Indian and Bulldog entries favored to make the grade.

There has been no indication how many players will be bracketed, but the two coast schools are expected to enter about six players apiece. Roseburg will enter as many players as it takes to fill out two brackets.

Titles will be decided in both singles and doubles matches, with pre-meet seeding leaving the doubles field wide open. The top two doubles teams and the two singles finalists in this meet will earn state berths.

Roseburg's Wayne Henninger and North Bend's Ron Gunther are heavy favorites to meet in the singles finals. In matches at North Bend last week, Henninger was a 6-1, 6-1 winner over Eugene's Jerry Wilson.

Douglas High Coach Resigns From Post

Roy Harrington, who in February said he "didn't know" if he would return to coach at Douglas High School, resigned today from varsity basketball and baseball posts at that school.

The 34-year old veteran baseball player said he had "a couple reasons" for quitting, but would give none other than to say that "I have a good opportunity for a job with the tax commission in Coos County, which I may take."

Harrington conceded that if he can get "a pretty good deal" somewhere, that he may seek with coaching. "It's not out of my blood yet," he said.

The Record
Harrington's most successful season in two years at Douglas, winning and losing, came with his 1954 Trojan baseball team, composed of freshmen and sophomores, which won 15 and lost three against major competition. He has called baseball his "primary interest."

His current baseball team, a pre-season dardhorse in the Umpqua Valley League, won two early non-league games and has since dropped three league games to hold down the cellar spot.

In basketball, his 1953-54 team, playing a jayvee schedule, finished with a 3-15 mark. This past season's basketball team had a record of five wins and 15 defeats.

Came From Taft
He came to Douglas from a coaching position at Taft High School where he coached for three years. He graduated from Willamette University in 1950.

No replacement was named by Douglas Principal Potter. It was the first coaching resignation at Douglas. Earlier this spring, Chuck Langsue was appointed new head football coach in an athletic department shakeup at the school. Harrington was to have coached baseball exclusively next year.

Phil Blomquist, who on Monday of this week pitched a no-run, no-hit game against defending champion Elkton, was accorded an unmerciful reception by Riddle's Irish Thursday as the home team pounded out a 12-4 decision over the Eagles.

Battered
The strong-armed lefthander was batted out of the box in the fourth inning at Riddle after succumbing to nine runs and 10 hits. He also walked four and struck out three men during his three inning stint.

The Irish began their assault in the third inning when they got to Blomquist for four runs which included a wild pitch by Phil and Sam Humphrey's three-base hit in the process.

Blomquist began his own downfall in the fourth frame when he misplayed Frank Raulston's infield ball. Stan Long was safe on a fielder's choice and when Frank Denton walked the bags were loaded.

Opposing pitcher Bill Edwards then singled Raulston home and the Yoncalla rightfielder contributed to the chaos when dropped John Useton's fly ball to allow another run to score. Larry Cockrell then blasted Blomquist from the mound for keeps on a two-run single. Kenny Means relieved for the Eagles with nobody out.

Edwards turned in a creditable winning performance, by contrast, for Riddle, striking out 13, walking two and giving up five hits. Reliever Means struck out five of 13 men to face him for Yoncalla.

Edwards, Cockrell and Useton each batted in three runs. Humphrey had a double, triple and a single in four trips to the plate.

Chiefs Accepted
Six league teams (Drain, Medford, Grants, Pass, Coquille, Bend and Bandon) have accepted the 1955 Chiefs' edition (guided by founding-father Hal Zurcher) with open arms, as was indicated that they would earlier this week. Now, says Zurcher, the biggest problem is rounding up suitable talent.

Outside sources will be the main supply of talent for this year's team with possibly three or four local men also contacted. College ballmen have furnished semi-pro baseball with most of its fuel in the summer pastime.

Play At Finlay
Finlay Field will again be the age-old site of Saturday night and Sunday afternoon matches among the Southern Oregon League. The ancient ballyard has a new screen behind home plate and new life will also be administered the home plate grandstand and turf field.

Evergreen Loop To Launch Round-Robin Action June 5

Managers of a revamped four-team Evergreen League, meeting in Roseburg Thursday evening, drew up a first-half round-robin schedule beginning play the Sunday of June 5.

In that round, Riddle is at Myrtle Creek and Roseburg is at Cottage Grove.

Cuts Forfeits
The managers attempted to put teeth into the league's bylaws by passing a constitution which virtually eliminates the forfeit. A forfeiture fee of \$20.00 per game for road teams is expected to help keep things in line among the ball clubs.

The rules state that all players in the league must have amateur standing.

Players in the league will be limited to those with "amateur standing." Players and coaches must be in uniform while participating in league games and each team shall be limited to 18 players including a player-manager.

Other laws provide for submission of team rosters and restrictions on players moving from one team to another. Provision has been made for two umpires to work each game.

Trophies will be awarded at the season's end to the league's leading hitter, the most valuable player and to the winning team.

The league will meet again in July to determine a second-half schedule. Games will be played every Sunday through July 17 except for the July 4 weekend.
