

Ex-Convict Gives Self Up After Knife Slaying
HUNTINGTON PARK, Calif. (AP)—A widespread manhunt for an ex-convict, wanted for questioning in the knife slaying of an attractive divorcee, ended early Friday when the wanted man walked into a church and surrendered to the minister. Rodney Shipman, 32, had been sought since Wednesday night when Mrs. Maye Pratt, 32, was stabbed fatally with a hunting knife at her home in the presence of her 12-year-old daughter.

Doctors Blocked Social Medicine
MIAMI BEACH, Fla. (AP)—Federal control over the medical profession has been blocked by doctors' and allied organizations, the American Medical Assn's Washington representative said here. Dr. Frank E. Wilson, speaking at the 102nd national convention of the American Pharmaceutical Assn., used the term "socialized medicine" which the profession applies to an effort toward federal health insurance or similar legislation. Wilson said "we would be much farther along the way toward socialized medicine" if such organizations had not maintained strong representation in Washington. "There would be by now, in my opinion, strong federal controls over all forms of medical and allied scientific and professional education—controls imported along with federal dollars," said the Washington representative.
