Officials Predict Very Dry Summer For Northwest
WASHINGTON (AP)—A geological survey official said Saturday the outlook is for a dry summer in the Pacific Northwest, for most of California, and in the Colorado, Rio Grande, Arkansas and Canadian River Basins.
William S. Eisenlohr Jr., of the survey's water resources division, gave that picture to newsmen on the basis of latest available reports.
He emphasized he could not say that those regions would have critical water shortages or droughts but he said they apparently face a dry time from now until Oct. 1. The outlook is principally for stream flow and stored water and is not a weather forecast.
Eisenlohr said the Pacific Northwest probably will be drier than in any recent year and no relief is in sight for the drought-stricken Southern California area around Los Angeles.
Among reports Eisenlohr had at hand were snow surveys as of April 1 by various government, state and other agencies.
They said in part:
Columbia River Basin—"In the southern half of Columbia Basin critical water-surely shortages are developing. The Big and Little Lost Rivers, the Big Wood, the Little Wood, Salmon Falls Creek and the Owyhee have low reservoir storage and a low snow pack."
The main stem of the Columbia River is forecast to flow less than it was for the past ten years... flows are forecast to range between a low of about 22 per cent of average in the Owyhee Basin to a high of near 90 per cent of average in those basins where a long term carryover constitutes a substantial part of the flow."

Aufderheide Sees Decline In Lane Timber Cutting

EUGENE (AP)—Timber has been cut off so fast in Lane County that the lumber industry within the county is certain to go into decline, Robert Aufderheide, Willamette National Forest supervisor, said.
He told the Chamber of Commerce that if the present rate of cutting continued, all the timber in the county would be depleted within 45 years.
"It appears that we're right at our peak, and the decline is setting in. Some mills will have to drop out, and as they close we'll have to find other payrolls and new tax bases," he said.
He said the heaviest cut of timber has been on privately owned lands. Aufderheide estimated 65 per cent of the timber had come from private lands. He added that only 25 per cent of the standing timber in the county now remains on private land.
He predicted that as privately owned timber becomes scarcer there will be much pressure exerted to increase the cut on national forests.

One Of Three Remaining Gaps In Highway Closed

PENNS BLANCA, Nicaragua (AP)—One of the three remaining gaps in the 320-mile Inter-American Highway was closed Saturday with dedication of a 12-mile stretch of new, all-weather road from La Cruz, Costa Rica, to the Nicaraguan border.
With the opening of the stretch at ceremonies on the Costa Rica-Mexico-Guatemala border became possible for the first time.
One remaining gap in the highway is in northern Panama and Southern Costa Rica, where 150 miles of road await construction, much of it through a jungle and mountainous area. The other 25 mile gap is in northern Guatemala. It will link the Mexican and Guatemalan portions of the road.

Emergency Board Authorizes Plans For New Buildings

SALEM (AP)—The State Emergency Board, which has the final say on starting the \$15,000,000 building program of the Legislature, has authorized here the drawing of plans for five of the projects.
The board approved drafting plans for the shop building at Oregon Technical Institute at Klamath Falls, the classroom building at Portland State College, remodeling of the state Agriculture Building, and construction at the prison and for the Fish Commission.
The bills for these projects contain emergency clauses so that the money will become available as soon as the governor signs them.
The board will get another look at these projects, because construction contracts can't be let without the board's approval.
Gov. Paul Patterson said he might veto the emergency clause on the Portland State Building. If he does, the appropriation won't be available for 90 days.
Patterson said he has asked Atty. Gen. Robert J. Thornton if the emergency clause would be legal. The governor pointed out that Portland State won't become an independent college for 90 days, so there is some question whether a building can be started at a college which doesn't exist.
The Emergency Board elected State President Elmo Smith, John Day, as chairman and Speaker Ed Geary, Klamath Falls, vice chairman. Rep. Henry Semon, also of Klamath Falls, is secretary.
Other board members are Sens. Howard C. Belton, Canby; John C. F. Merrifield, Portland; and Reps. George Ulett, Coquille; and Reps. Loran L. Stewart, Coquille Grove; Alfred H. Corbett, Portland; and Leon S. Davis, Hillsboro.

Glendale Man Arrested On Two Separate Counts

A 56-year-old Glendale man who was under arrest by Roseburg police for a time Saturday evening on one charge finally wound up in jail on a second count.
Dewey Blevins was stopped at the city limits after an out-of-town motorist phoned city police to notify them of a driver weaving his car down Highway 99 toward Roseburg from Sutherlin. He was booked on a charge of reckless driving.
Police said he had been drinking, so when Blevins posted \$75 bail, officers warned him not to drive. Blevins went to a restaurant. Half an hour later, police said they checked on him and found him "passed out" in the restroom.
Blevins was placed under arrest for being drunk in a public place. He was to be arraigned in municipal court today.

The expected signing of the Austrian treaty of independence.
(In Washington, the White House reported an exchange of cables between Eisenhower and Dulles over the weekend but declined to say whether a top-level Big Four conference was the subject.)
Asked about the Paris reports, White House press secretary James C. Hagerty told newsmen the President and Dulles "have been in communication by cable."
(The press secretary added that Eisenhower and Undersecretary of State Herbert Hoover Jr. conferred Sunday and again Monday.)
(In recent news conferences Eisenhower has indicated he would prefer a meeting of Big Four foreign ministers in advance of any top-level conference. On March 23 he said he would favor "new exploratory talks" after the now-completed ratification of agreements to rearm West Germany.)
(Late last month the President said he saw no occasion at that time for a conference of the chiefs of state.)
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
