2-Year-Old McMinnville Boy Found Alive, And Well After All-Night Search

McMINNVILLE, Ore. (AP) — A 2-year-old boy who wandered away from a house on the Oregon Coast Range foothills Sunday morning was found Monday in the woods, alive and apparently all right, but completely exhausted.

Two loggers discovered the child, Jess Davis, about a mile from the home of his grandparents, from which he had walked off 24 hours before. It appeared that the child had covered about six miles, part by road and part over hill, in a circuitous journey.

The boy, lightly clad, apparently had stayed awake the entire time in temperatures that once dropped to about the freezing level. The child, son of Mr. and Mrs.

James F. Davis, Dallas, Ore., was brought to a hospital here for treatment for exposure and possible shock.

Max Ward and Viggo Horlyk, loggers who were walking through the woods in the Panther Creek area some 18 miles southwest of here, heard a child crying. They took him to the John C. Krauss farm to await arrival of Sheriff's Deputy Ford Hagan, who drove him to McMinnville.

Hagan said the child was wet and muddy, as if he had been wading, and his legs were scratched from vines.

Searchers were puzzled about how he got so far in the brush-covered, hilly country.

The boy wandered away from the farm home of his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. William Fagan, where he was visiting with his parents and three sisters. He had been playing in the back yard while the other children were in front. The family said he had been gone only 10 minutes when missed.

An exhaustive ground search by 100 police and volunteers and three bloodhounds failed to find the child Sunday, although it was continued until after midnight.

Norman Wilson, formerly of Los Gatos, Calif., and his hounds, who were hunting for two successful Oregon searches in the past several days, remained out until 1 a.m.

They resumed the search with police, National Guardsmen and volunteers Monday morning.

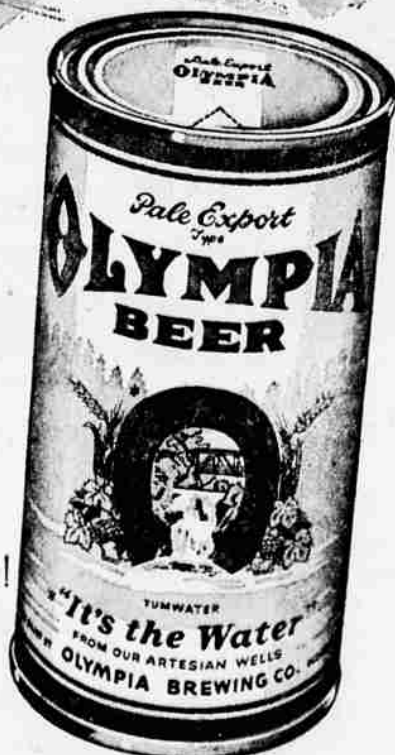
