Children Taking Part In Test Vaccine Trials

CLINTON, Ill. (AP)—Children in DeWitt County are participating in a trial test inoculation of Salk polio vaccine designed to provide longer immunity.

Some 150 children from 6 months to 10 years of age received trial shots Wednesday and another 250 will be inoculated Thursday. The vaccine is produced by Parke, Davis and Co. of Detroit. The company says the vaccine contains an "additive" which will slow absorption in the blood stream.

Such a process, the company said, should provide a longer period of immunity and also increase the vaccine's effectiveness.

The company said the vaccine is not the same type used in the recent nationwide inoculation of first and second graders. (Parke, Davis vaccine will be used in the mass inoculation of schoolchildren in Washington state.)
