## 139 Bodies Recovered In Japanese Disaster

TAKAMATSU, Japan — Divers brought up dozens of bodies — most of them of schoolchildren — from the cold waters of the Inland sea today to raise to 139 the number of corpses recovered from Tuesday's fog-shrouded ferry collision.

Still missing are 24 persons. A total of 775 were rescued, including 51 injured. Long lines of weeping parents and relatives milled through the incense-choked halls of a temporary morgue here, attempting to identify the young victims who carried no identity papers.
