armament plan to be policed by an agency with "unrestricted access" to potential war-making facilities.

This disarmament feature was contained in 16 pages of documents made public in London and Washington.

The documents are the proposals made at the London Disarmament Conference during Feb. 25-May 9.

The State Department released the documentary record of the secret meetings after Russia

broadcast world-wide its own disarmament plan.

As American officials had reported earlier in a tentative analysis, the documents showed marked similarity on some points between previous Allied proposals and the new Russian suggestions. The main difference has been on powers to be granted a control agency.

Russia has stood out against giving international inspectors full rights to visit plants.

Six Companies Awarded Contracts For Gas Line

HOUSTON, Tex. (AP)—Six companies were awarded contracts totaling \$11,238,000 Friday for construction of 635-miles of Pacific Northwest Pipeline Co.'s new natural gas line from the San Juan Basin to the Pacific Northwest.

The first contracts call for construction of 387 miles of 26-inch pipe and 268 miles of 22-inch pipe from Ignacio, Colo., to Burley, Idaho. The entire pipeline, when completed, will stretch 1,466 miles.
