Senate Investigation Recalls '5 Per Centers'

WASHINGTON (AP)—A new Senate investigation reminiscent of the "5 per center" probes conducted during the Truman administration is in the making.
Starting Wednesday, the Senate Investigations subcommittee will hold public hearings in an inquiry described by Chairman McClellan (D-Ark) over the weekend as involving "corruption" in clothing contracts for the armed forces.
He said the gift of at least one home freezer had been disclosed in testimony already taken behind closed doors, but he added, "It goes beyond that to actual cash payments."

Examinations Set For Appointments To US Academies

Cong. Harris Ellsworth has announced that competitive examinations will be held Monday, July 11, for appointments to vacancies at the U. S. Naval Academy, U. S. Military Academy and the U. S. Air Force Academy. The examinations will be conducted by the U. S. Civil Service Commission at post office buildings in Albany, Coos Bay, Eugene, Gold Beach, Grants Pass, Medford, Reedsport and Roseburg.

Candidates for the academies must never have been married and must be bona fide residents of the Fourth Congressional District. As of the date of entrance into the academies, July 1, 1956, appointees must be 17 years of age. The maximum age at entrance for all academies is 22. Candidates now in the armed services are also eligible to compete.

The Civil Service examination will be limited to vocabulary, reading, spatial relations and algebra. Nominations of principals and alternates to the academies will be on the basis of grades earned in the competitive examination.

Candidates desiring to compete for vacancies at the academies should notify Cong. Ellsworth at the House Office Building, Washington, D. C., not later than June 1, indicating their choice of place of examination, legal residence and date of birth.
