Diem Presides Over Ceremonies Of Free Viet Nam

DALAT, South Viet Nam (AP) — Premier Ngo Dinh Diem presided in Dalat this week over historic ceremonies marking the completion of free Viet Nam's territorial and military unity.

The nationalist leader quit Saigon for the first time since the political and military crisis broke in mid-March to receive an oath of loyalty from the newly abolished Imperial Guard and commemorate the turning over of ex-Premier Bao Dai's crown domains, or mountain provinces, to the government.

The Imperial Guard, whose officers and noncoms voted last Friday to ask that its designation be changed, became the last important South Vietnamese military forces to be integrated into the national army.

"Down with Bao Dai!" the crowd shouted. "Down with the Vietminh! Long live Ngo Dinh Diem!"

BULLDOZER SWIPES TRUCK
