## World Hop Crop 9 Million Pounds Below That In '53

WASHINGTON — The 1954 world hop crop was about 9 million pounds smaller than in 1953, the U. S. Department of Agriculture reports.

Last year's crop, harvested in the Northern Hemisphere in the late months of 1954 and in the Southern Hemisphere in the early months of 1955, was estimated at 133,300,000 pounds.

The 1953 crop was 142,000,000 pounds. The year of greatest production was 1951 when 154,500,000 pounds were grown.

The report said the reduction in 1954 production was due to smaller than usual crops in Canada, the United Kingdom, West Germany, France, Belgium and Yugoslavia.

The European nations had short crops because of wet, cool weather, the report said.

The reductions in these countries offset the increased production in the United States, Japan and Australia. The United States has largest single production with a crop of 43,491,000 pounds reported.

U. S. exports in the first half of the current marketing season totaled 8,900,000 pounds compared with 7,800,000 pounds in a comparable period the previous year. This was due largely to increased sales to Canada, Mexico and Europe.

Supplies on hand in the United States at the beginning of the current marketing season were estimated at 26 million pounds. That is about 1,100,000 pounds more than the carryover on Sept. 1, 1953.

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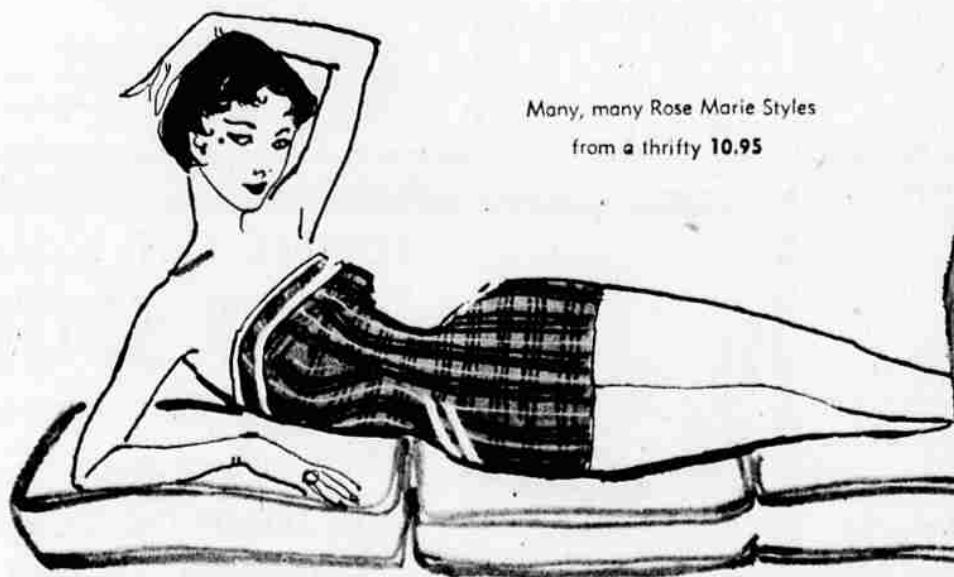
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
