

FORMER RED ELECTED

KAMAISHI, Japan (AP)—A former Communist leader here has been elected mayor of this Northern Japanese city famed for its big steel plant. Tomin Suzuki, 59, who ran as an independent, drew 13,264 votes to 11,432 for incumbent Gonzaemon Sawada. Suzuki is the first Japanese with a Communist background to become mayor of a major city. He no longer belongs to the party.

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Speeches Revise U.S. Air Forces, Reds Appraisal

WASHINGTON (AP)—Two speeches by high Air Force officials—one revised just before delivery to tone down comparisons—brought the Air Force line on Soviet air power into sharper focus here a week of confusion.

In summary, this appeared to be the top level view: The Reds are a threat in the air and the threat is growing, as implied in the Pentagon statement that started the discussion a week ago.

But with enough money applied steadily to research and development, America can stay ahead. Lt. Gen. Thomas S. Power, commander of the Air Force Research Development Command, was the officer who didn't say what he started out to say in a speech prepared for the New England Council in Boston.

At one point the original said the Soviets have "resources in manpower and materiel we could not possibly match." At another point it spoke of bombers "comparable to our B47 and B52."

That was switched abruptly to "imposing resources in manpower and materiel" without the reference to whether this country can match them, and to bombers only "similar" to the American jet bombers.

It was Trevor Gardner, assistant secretary of the Air Force for research and development, who came out with the talk of steady work and money.

In a speech at an Air Force Assn. luncheon, Gardner talked of "apprehension" over the disclosure of new and apparently highly developed Soviet planes. He said they "are reaffirming that the Soviet has vast technological resources."

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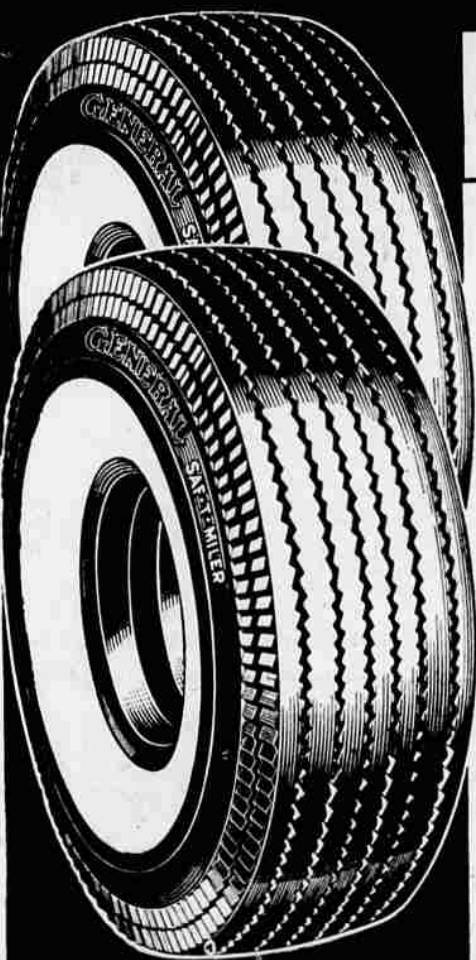
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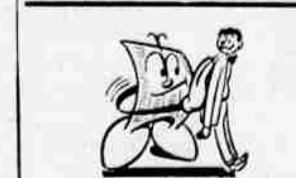
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2-Year-Old Baby Strolls While Sitter Takes Nap
