Duncan says Brewer was driving Lillywhite's logging truck at the time. He asks \$10,000 general damages from the defendants.



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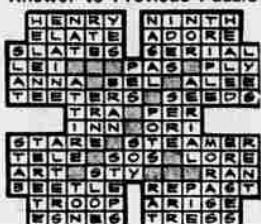

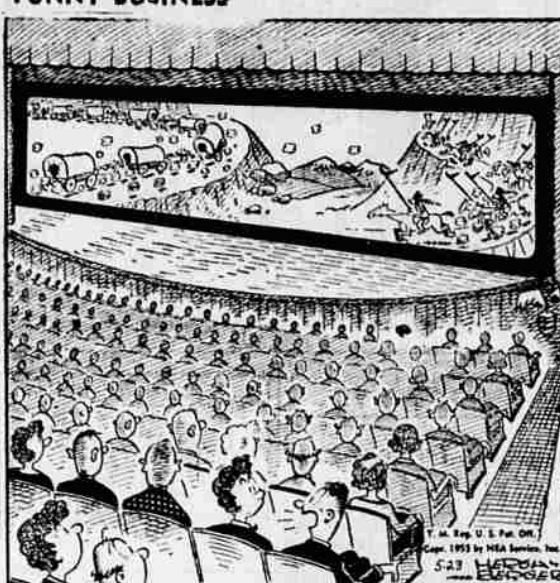
