RENO, Nev. (AP) — William McKenzie, second in command of the Nevada highway patrol, was shot to death Sunday by his wife, who then took her own life. Coroner William Beemer reported. The bodies of the couple were found side by side in their bed behind a locked door at their home.

McKenzie was 43, his wife 42. Beemer said relatives could give no reason for the shooting.

British Railway Firemen, Engineers Call Strike

LONDON (AP) — British Railway firemen and engineers here have called a nationwide railroad strike for May 28—two days after the British national election. At almost the same time, a dock union threatened to strike against four key British ports next Monday, three days before the voting.

The rail strike threat sprang out of a demand for higher wages. Dockers threatened a walkout at London, Liverpool, Manchester and Hull in an inter-union jurisdictional dispute. The strikes would paralyze much of Britain's transport.

HURLS CHARGES

TOKYO (AP) — Peiping Radio charged here recently the new U.S. military assistance agreement with Cambodia "is a measure to suppress the Cambodian government." 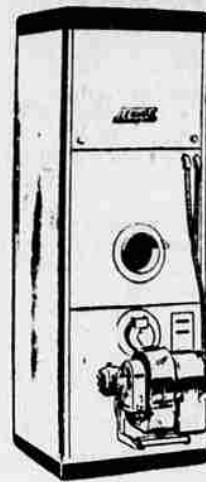
TO RAISE SALARIES
