62 Sheep And A Goat Killed By Predators

Douglas County predatory animal hunters found 62 sheep and a goat killed by predators during the first three months of this year.

This report was made this week in a joint statement from the district agent of the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Predatory Animal Control Office and the State Dept. of Agriculture.

Coyotes were toughest on the county's flocks. They killed 35 sheep. Other killers were: Dogs 14, raccoons 8, bobcats 4 and mountain lion 1.

This is probably not the complete picture. These livestock losses are only those discovered by predatory hunters in their routine operations, the statement says.
