2 Blondes Spend Night On Carrier

SAN PEDRO, Calif. — Question of the week aboard the aircraft carrier USS Point Cruz: "Do you know a blonde from San Pedro?"

Officers are questioning sailors named "Jim" or "Joe" on the baby flattop to try to find out how two San Pedro girls—both blonde, both 17—managed to spend a night aboard the ship.

The Point Cruz is at sea now, on maneuvers. It left Monday as the story of the two teen-agers began to unfold.

They had been missing from their homes Saturday night, and returned with a tale of having been kidnapped. Later they told juvenile officers they actually spent the night aboard the Point Cruz, then tied up in San Pedro.

The girls told the officers they went aboard the ship Saturday with Armed Forces Day visitors, were hidden away by two sailor friends they knew only as "Jim" and "Joe," and then went ashore unnoticed in the midst of Sunday's visitors.
