

## Eisenhower Reached Deep Into List Of Eligibles For Navy Chief Of Staff Choice

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower reached far down the promotion list Wednesday for a successor to Adm. Robert B. Carney, his chief of naval operations and the center of a hot controversy over Red China and the Formosa Strait.

Eisenhower nominated Rear Adm. Arleigh A. (31-knot) Burke for the top navy job. Burke himself was a storm center for having helped masterminding the "admirals' revolt" of 1949 against emphasis being placed on the Air Force's B36 bombers.

In that, controversy Burke was closely associated with Adm. Arthur Radford, whom Eisenhower nominated Wednesday for a new two-year term as chairman of the joint chiefs of staff.

The President completed a reshuffle of his military high command by naming Gen. Nathan F. Twining for a second two-year term as Air Force chief of staff. Earlier in the month he nominated Gen. Maxwell D. Taylor to take over July 1 from Gen. Matthew Ridgway as Army Chief of Staff. Ridgway, too, had been involved in controversy, disagreeing publicly with administration plans for a cut in Army strength. His term would have expired in August with the other joint chiefs, but he chose to request retirement June 30.

Burke's appointment is to be effective when Carney's two-year term expires Aug. 16.

The White House denied, in answer to questions, that the controversy over what Carney did or did not say about the likelihood of an early Red attack in the Formosa Strait had anything to do with the shift. James C. Hagerty, press secretary, said Eisenhower had directed him to praise Carney's "distinguished and outstanding record."

Carney is 60, and Hagerty said he could not fill out another two-year term before he reaches normal retirement age.

## Kremlin Sends Tito Greetings On 63rd Birthday

LONDON (AP) — The Kremlin sent birthday greetings Wednesday to President Tito of Yugoslavia for the first time in seven years. This came as the Western world nervously watched Russia's stepped-up wooing of her once vilified Communist outcast.

Tito celebrated his 63rd birthday only 24 hours before Thursday's arrival of top Soviet brass in Belgrade for talks aimed at "normalization" of relations broken off in 1948. Tito was kicked out of the Red family of nations then as a traitor and renegade to world communism.

Belgrade Radio said the Russian president, Marshal Klementi Voroshilov, messaged Tito: "Accept sincere congratulations for your birthday and best wishes for health and fruitful work for the well being of the people of Yugoslavia and for the benefit of peace."

Yugoslavia has given formal assurance to the United States and Britain that the visit of Soviet Premier Nikolai Bulganin and Soviet party boss Nikita Khrushchev implies no change in her relations with the West.

## Commission Halts Overnight Camps At Several Parks

PORTLAND (AP) — The Oregon State Highway Commission opened a series of construction bids Wednesday and later in taking up reports, decided to halt overnight camping at a number of state parks.

The camping halt will be on recommendation of C. H. Armstrong, parks superintendent, who said they get too little use to justify the cost.

The affected parks: Gov. Patterson Memorial Park south of Waldport on Highway 101; Dorris State Park near Vida on U. S. 126; Booth State Park west of Lakeview on state Highway 66; Chandler State Park north of Lakeview on U. S. 395; Cline Falls Wayside, west of Redmond on U. S. 126; Shelton State Park near Fossil on state Highway 19; Painted Hills State Park near Mitchell off U. S. 26; and Red Bridge State Park west of La Grande off U. S. 30.

## COMPENSATION

TOKYO (AP) — Japan announced Wednesday it had deposited \$12,600,000 in pounds sterling with the International Red Cross at Geneva as compensation for soldiers interned here in World War II. The Foreign Office said the action fulfilled an obligation under Article 16 of the Japanese peace treaty
