

Electric Power Jumps To High For Seven Weeks

NEW YORK (AP) — The nation's electric power production last week jumped to the highest level in seven weeks and surpassed the total a year ago by 15.2 per cent. Edison Electric Institute reported Wednesday.

Major factors in the high output, said industry observers, were a steady rise in consumption at new atomic energy installations and a sharp increase in the air conditioning and refrigeration load.

Production totaled 9,730,000 kilowatt-hours, compared with 9,673,000 kilowatt-hours the week before and 8,373,000 kilowatt-hours in the same week of 1954. The Pacific Northwest was up 13.5 per cent.

Germans Warned Against Taking Neutrality Stand

DUESSELDORF, Germany (AP) — U. S. Ambassador James B. Conant warned the Germans Tuesday that neutral Germany would be unable to defend itself against the Russians even if it were armed.

"The idea that a country like Germany, which has no natural boundaries at all, could defend itself alone outside a European defense system simply ignores the new military realities," Conant told a German audience.

"A single nation which is not protected by any alliance cannot protect itself so long as the present threat from the East exists."

"And fine words alone cannot convince us that such a threat no longer exists. Fine words must be followed by deeds before we are

convinced of their honesty."
