

New System Predicts How Much Rain Expected

OSAKA, Japan (AP) — Five Tokyo University scientists have developed a method which they say tells not only if it is going to rain, but how much.

The scientists submitted their findings to the Japan Meteorological Society Congress.

They reported 100 per cent success in predicting time and extent of three typhoon-borne rainstorms here last year and in other tests, dating back to 1939.

The new system, the report said, is based on the amount of vapor in three stages of the earth's atmosphere—on the ground, at 3 kilometers (1.86 miles) and 5 kilometers (3.1 miles).

The vapor is measured and figures for the next several hours are projected. The process is continually repeated. The scientists say there can be no error if the initial values are accurate.

KILLED BY TERRORIST

PARIS (AP) — Nationalist terrorists killed a National Assembly deputy's relative in Algeria Wednesday night. Minor disturbances continued to make French North Africa uneasy. The fatal shooting occurred in the Algerian village of Makouda, where Ider Ahmed, father-in-law of a Roman Catholic Algerian member of the French National Assembly, was killed. He was a village councilman.
