### Sale Of Timber Brings \$463,250

An Umpqua National Forest sale of 11,900,000 board feet of timber Friday in Roseburg brought a total price of \$463,250. Winning bidder was Bohemia Lumber Co., Clatsop Creek.

The timber, on 272 acres 32 miles east of Cottage Grove, had been appraised at \$306,650. Bohemia paid \$41.05 per thousand for Douglas fir. The 10,800,000 feet had been appraised at \$26.55 per thousand. Appraised prices were bid for 600,000 feet of hemlock and 500,000 feet of pine (\$33.40 per thousand).

There were five other bidders on the tract: Vancouver Plywood Co. of Vancouver, Wash.; Gustina Bros. Lumber Co. of Eugene, U.S. Plywood Corp. of Eugene, U.S.; Woodard Lumber Co. of Cottage Grove, and Springfield Lumber Co. of Springfield.

court, admitted holding the gun but accused Noblin of being in on the stickup plans. The third man, Campbell, was not present for the hearing. He is free on bail.

Dep. Dist. Atty. Don H. Sanders called only Powell to the stand, while A. C. Roll, Noblin's attorney, had several relatives and friends of Noblin testify.

In the Leslie hearing, both Leslie and his son, William Jr., about 16, gave testimony to the court, as did several others.

He is accused in aiding in the escape of Hollis Lee McCloud, Springfield, Utah, who still is at large and charged with assault with intent to kill. Victim in the case was Albert Jerry Bowles, 24, Reedsport.

Bowles and others told the court that Leslie was present during the altercation, in which McCloud is said to have attempted to shoot Bowles. The gun misfired, and Bowles claims he then became a victim of a gun-whipping.

But Leslie and his son, who was near the scene, claimed they only sought to aid McCloud, who, other witnesses said, was pummeled by neighbors when the incident was broken up. McCloud, in some way, fell or was thrown into Scheffle Slough, where Bowles has a houseboat in which the alleged assault took place. Leslie admitted helping him from the water and driving him back to Coos Bay.

McCloud now is in Utah, where the acting governor only recently refused extradition. A second man accused of aiding in the escape is Walter D. Baird, 24, Springfield, Utah, and he is in the county jail here awaiting preliminary hearing. He didn't testify.

Sanders called Bowles' 18-year-old wife, Janice, to the stand and she corroborated her husband's story, as did other state witnesses. Roll also represented Leslie.
