

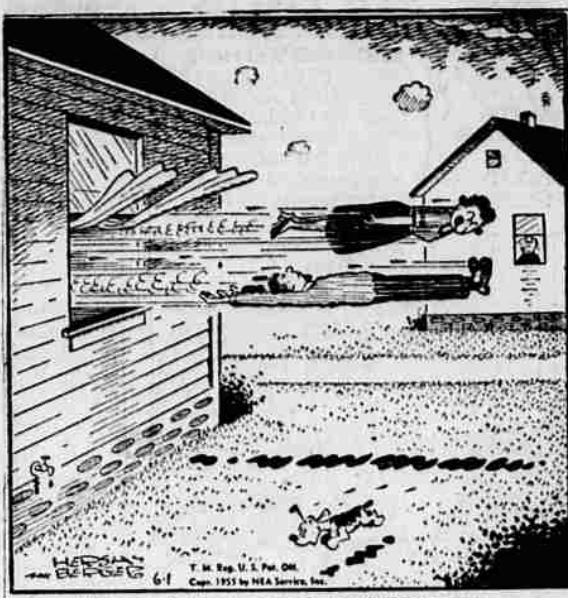
Kaiser Spokesman Says Senator's Words False

WASHINGTON (AP) — D. A. Rhoades, vice president and general manager of the Kaiser Aluminum and Chemical Corp., has described as "completely erroneous and misleading" a statement by Sen. Murray (D-Mont.). Rhoades said the statement to which he took exception was the effect that the Kaiser firm "had not complied with its contracts to supply non-integrated aluminum users." He said Murray made the statement in a letter to Mobilization Director Arthur S. Flemming. Kaiser Aluminum, Rhoades' statement said, "at all times has exceeded its obligations to supply non-integrated users under the company's contracts."

A Commerce Department official recently testified before a House subcommittee that many complaints have been received from small makers of aluminum products that the big producers are holding back aluminum for their own use and depriving their independent customers.

Senator George Would Support Freer Trade Bill

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. George (D-Ga.) said Tuesday he will support a move by some advocates of freer world trade to revise an amendment to President Eisenhower's foreign trade bill.

George, one of the Senate conferees on the measure, told a reporter that his amendment, sponsored by Sen. Millikin (R-Colo.), has been the chief obstacle to Senate-House agreement on a compromise bill.

Sen. Byrd (D-Va.), heading the Senate conferees, said another effort probably will be made Thursday to settle the differences with the House. But he said he would not predict whether a final agreement can be reached then.

The Senate passed the bill May 4, preserving the key liberalized trade features asked by the President but adding a number of amendments. In the intervening 3 1/2 weeks, the two branches have not been able to get together on a compromise.

House Democrats, contending they had made a successful floor fight to avoid any changes in the Eisenhower measure, have bitterly attacked the Millikin amendment.

They said it would open the way to a flood of new "escape clause" cases in which industries could demand withdrawal or modification of tariff concessions given to foreign nations in reciprocal trade pacts.

Millikin, another of the Senate conferees on the bill, said in a separate interview he is not conceding the House Democrats are sound in their objections to his amendment.

He said it might be possible to make some language changes, but that he would insist the principle be preserved.

The amendment considerably broadens the grounds under which industries can seek relief from tariff cuts granted in reciprocal trade agreements.

FARM PRICES DECLINE

WASHINGTON (AP) — Prices received by farmers declined 1 per cent between mid-April and mid-May, the Agriculture Department reported Friday.

The index of prices received, based on the 1910-14 average, declined 3 points to 224.

Lower prices for beef cattle, strawberries, milk and eggs contributed largely to the decline in the index in the past month.

The index of prices paid by farmers also declined nearly 1 per cent. This includes such things as interest, taxes, wages and commodities bought by farmers.

The most important element in the decline was a further drop in prices paid for feeder livestock. The parity ratio index remained at 87 or 3 per cent below a year ago.

Aandahl Requests Reclamation Fund

WASHINGTON (AP) — Fred G. Aandahl, assistant secretary of the Interior, Tuesday urged a Senate appropriations subcommittee to approve \$179,616,000 for the Reclamation Bureau for the year starting July 1. This is 16 million dollars more than the bureau got for the current fiscal year.

The request includes \$146,041,000 for construction work, of which \$4,386,000 would be used to begin work on five new irrigation projects: Chief Joseph Dam, Washington; Deschutes, Haystack, equalizing reservoir, Oregon; Michaud Flat's, Idaho; Palo Verde, Arizona; California; and Santa Maria, California.

The balance would be used to continue work on projects now underway.

E. G. Nielson, assistant reclamation commissioner said the bureau expects to complete work on four projects within the next year, including the Crescent Lake Dam in Oregon.
