Women Would End Confusion On Discoveries

By RUTH COWAN PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Alarmed by confusion over the Salk polio vaccine, the General Federation of Women's Clubs here is considering a resolution demanding better advance planning in future medical discoveries of prime importance are announced. The resolution asks that research scientists, manufacturers, distributors and governmental agencies work together untiringly to assure a safe, effective plan to use for medical discoveries. Failure to do so brings confusion, lack of confidence and heartbreak to the families of America, the resolution says in noting that research is under way seeking the cause, prevention and cure of many other ailments and diseases. "At any moment may come announcements which are comparable in importance to that of the discovery of the Salk polio vaccine formula with its, inestimable values," it said.

Eisenhower Fascinated With Job, But Still Mum On Intent

By JACK BELL. WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower said Tuesday he is fascinated by the work of the presidency. But he gave no clear indication whether he intends to run again. A reporter at the President's news conference reminded him that it will be three years Wednesday since he returned from Europe to begin the campaign which gave him the Republican presidential nomination and ended with his election in November, 1952. In the light of that fact the reporter asked the President how he likes politics. Eisenhower said the term politics has many meanings but so often it is used in a derogatory sense. In that general sense, he said, he does not like politics. But he said any man possessing the authority of the presidency and the influence that it carries in working toward a peaceful world and minimizing the danger of war finds it fascinating. The discussion of politics also touched on the selection of Richard M. Nixon to be his vice presidential running mate in 1952. Eisenhower said that shortly after he was nominated and the question of a vice presidential candidate came up, he wrote out the names of five or six younger men whom he admired. Nixon's name was among those, he added. He did not say how Nixon happened to be picked from among the five or six.

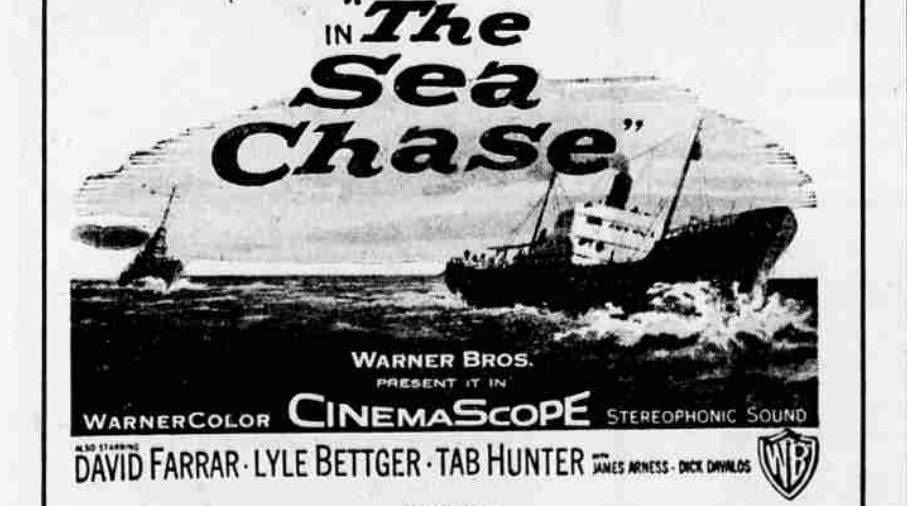
