SUTHERLIN DANCE CLUB HAS MEETING

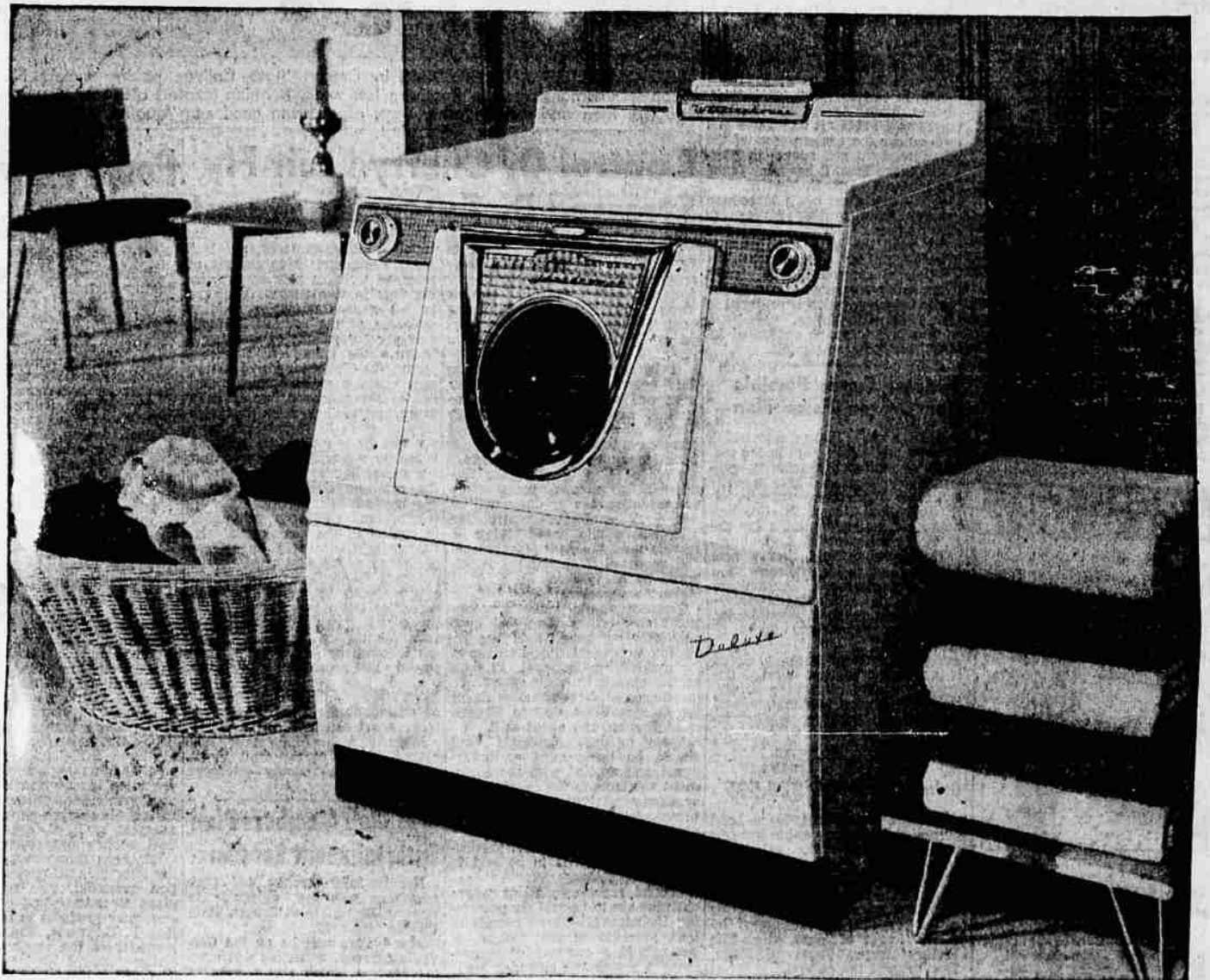

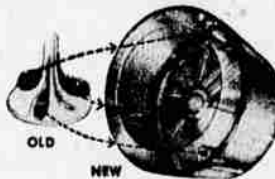
