Prineville Area Milk Price War Settled

PRINEVILLE — A milk price war, which broke out here last week, ended Sunday with distributors announcing they were returning to normal prices of 90 cents a gallon.
 Jim Bickers, an independent dairy operator who sells raw milk only, has agreed to remain out of the processed milk field. In return, two Central Oregon pool dairymen who had cut raw milk from 90 to 60 cents a gallon, said they would restore the higher price.
 The threat of the price war spreading to the Redmond and Bend areas was apparently eliminated by the truce here.

WALDFORD — Floyd Alfred Phillips, 27, Albany, drowned in the Alsea River near tide water Saturday, despite efforts of a brother-in-law to rescue him after a wave capsize their fishing boat.

 Velkenburg rescued young Powell and then swam back in an attempt to rescue Phillips, who was floundering in the water. Velkenburg was too exhausted, however, to subdue the frenzied Phillips, and was unable to get him to shore.
