

Portland Mayor Names Milk Strike Probers

PORTLAND (AP) — Mayor Fred L. Peterson Monday named the two members of the committee who will serve with him in investigating the labor dispute that halted Portland's milk deliveries last week.

The Rev. James Fogarty, head of the department of economics at Portland University, was picked from a list acceptable to the AFL dairy workers.

Edgar Smith, financier and wheat rancher, was selected from a list acceptable to the distributors.

The committee will submit a report within 60 days. The tieup ended Saturday with Peterson's suggestion that a fact-finding group investigate the dispute—a move similar to that which brought a return to work last fall in the lumber strike.

WEST POINT, N. Y. (AP) — President Eisenhower cautioned Tuesday against any "fatuous expectations" that the proposed Big Four conference will miraculously cure "a world sick with ignorance, mutual fears and hate."

The struggle to win an enduring peace "may last a generation," the President said in the commencement address at his alma mater, the U. S. Military Academy.
