Trico Timber Co. Winning Bidder

Trico Timber Co. of Dillard was winning bidder Monday for 28,100,000 board feet of national forest timber, located some 25 miles east of Tiller. The company paid \$668,030.

Forest service personnel said it was the biggest volume sale of timber scheduled for 1955. Appraised value had been \$415,880 on the timber which was mainly Douglas fir.

The 20,500,000 board feet of Douglas fir had been appraised at \$13.50 per 1,000 board feet. Remainder of the volume comprised 2,900,000 board feet of pine, 2,000,000 board feet of Shasta red fir and 2,700,000 board feet of hemlock and other species.

Appraised price on pine was \$40.25, that of red fir \$6.95 and hemlock \$3.15. The winning bidder paid appraised value on all but the Douglas fir.

There were six other bidders: Umpqua Plywood Corp., Myrtle Creek; Harbor Plywood Corp., Riddle; Stomar Lumber Co., Riddle; Roseburg Lumber Co., Scott Logging Co., Tiller; and the Martin Bros. Box Co. of Oregon, Oakland.

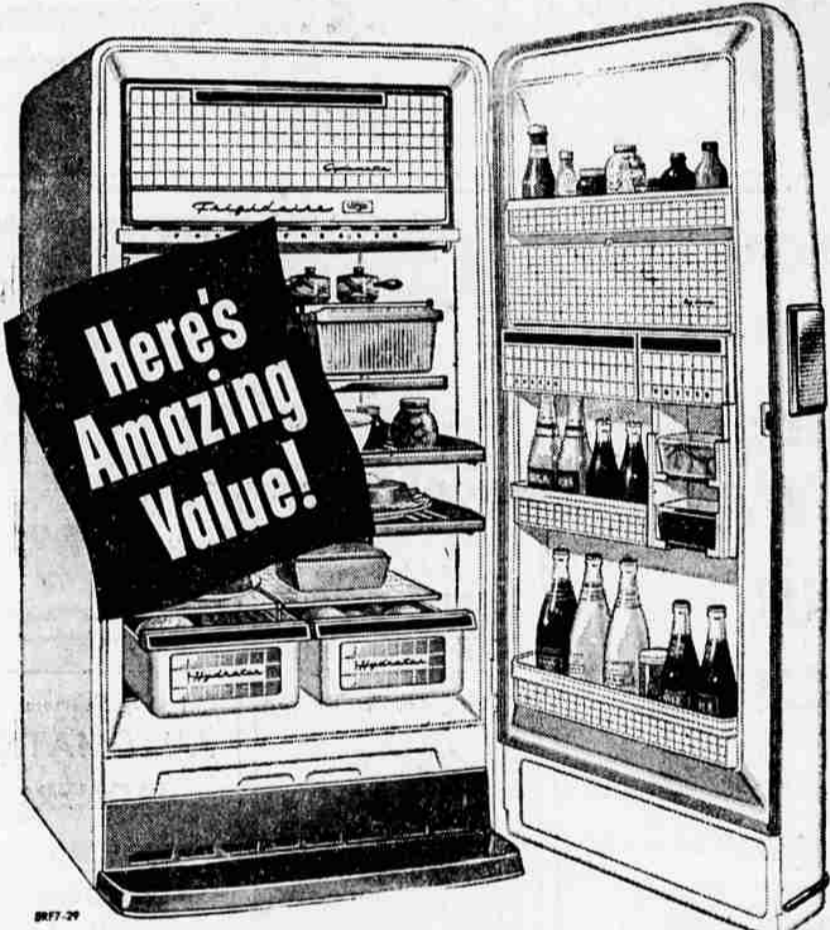
