**House Committee Votes Gas Producers Exemption**

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House Commerce Committee voted 16-15 Wednesday to exempt natural gas producers from federal regulation. The vote was on a motion to report favorably to the House a bill by Rep. Harris (D-Ark) to remove Federal Power Commission controls over producers' prices for gas sold to interstate pipelines. Before the final tally, the committee first voted 17-14 to reconsider a 14-14 tie vote Tuesday which would have shelved the measure. The committee then voted down 19-12, a motion to delay action on the issue for ten days and refer it to a subcommittee. Finally it approved the bill by a one vote margin.

**Fire Levels Beachfront Area In New Jersey**

SEASIDE HEIGHTS, N. J. (AP) — A rampaging fire driven by a stiff northeast wind reduced a four-block area of beachfront concessions to ashes Thursday. Damage was estimated at one million dollars. Fire companies from a 15-mile area converged on this oceanfront resort as the towering flames threatened for a time to vault a narrow street into a congested hotel and rooming house section. The fire spread to adjoining Seaside Park. At least 84 amusement and food stands were leveled by the blaze that raged wildly for about two and a half hours before a small army of 150 firefighters could bring it under control at about 8:30 a.m.
