Grants Pass Next On List

The Roseburg Chiefs, reinforced by the addition of four new players, resume Southern Oregon League play Saturday night with a one-game home stand against the Grants Pass Elks.

Although Grants Pass has been winless in four trips to the pot so far this season, the team provides a good attraction under the management of Mel Ingram, an ex-Roseburg High coach now coaching at Grants Pass High school.

The two teams meet again Sunday afternoon at Grants Pass.

Players Added
Players added to the Roseburg roster in the past week for this series include two University of Oregon freshmen ball players of the past season, an ex-Chief just out of service and a 1955 Vale High School graduate.

From Oregon come Jerry Waldrop, an outfielder, and Ron Whitaker, a pitcher who toiled for Eugene High before graduation. John Ferrell, who played here in 1953, is an ex-Grant High and Oregon State performer who is just returning from two years in the service. Ferrell plays both first base and in the outfield.

From Vale comes 18-year old Tony Arana, an infielder with high school experience and a record for the Shrine high school all-star football game.

Injured Recovering
The Roseburg injured, meanwhile continue to recover. Catcher Joe Niro, hit in the eye during pregame batting practice at Coquille last Sunday, is expected to be ready for the coming series. He saw only pinch-hit action in the Coquille Sunday game.

Both first baseman Bill Christensen and third baseman Bill Harper, nursing an ankle sprain and a charley horse, respectively, are also expected to be at full strength again.

Some of the Grants Pass regulars who should play leading roles in the series are Mel Friend, reliable catcher - outfielder, Clint Reese, pitcher - outfielder, Brad Lucas, ex-GP and Willamette University hurler and Dick James, shortstop and Oregon football star.

Nashua Favored In Belmont Go

NEW YORK (AP)—Names will be entered and post positions drawn today for the 87th running of the Belmont stakes, and Nashua is going to be an odds-on favorite to bring Sunny Jim Fitzsimmons his sixth victory in the \$10,000 classic.

The mile and one-half "test of the champion" will be raced at Belmont Park tomorrow afternoon, and a field of seven and possibly eight 3-year-olds is expected.

A late check up on trainers showed the following willing, if not able, to meet Nashua, the beaten Kentucky Derby favorite who regained a lot of stature two weeks ago by copying the Prekness.

C. V. Whitney's Little Dell, the Barclay Stable's Blazing Count, Lady Lawrence's Jabneh, the Cain Hoy Stables' Flying Fury, the Clearwater Stable's Portersville, and the King Ranch's Retamero.

Another horse who may be entered, but scratched later, is J. M. Seider's Uncle Gus, a fugitive from the claiming races.

The Belmont is a quarter of a mile longer than the Kentucky Derby.

Only Nashua and Flying Fury raced in the Derby, won by Swaps who returned to California. Nashua is the only one of the Belmont field to have started in the Prekness.
