

Yankees Head For Cleveland Camp With Five-Game Lead

Are the New York Yankees being conned into a false sense of security, or is that really a bunch of dead injuns back there in third place in the American League? The next three days may tell. The Yanks move into Cleveland

tonight for a four-game series. Having disposed of a two-game losing string and Detroit 7-3 yesterday, the Bombers barge into Municipal Stadium with a fast 5-game lead over the second place Chicago White Sox and a 5½-game spread over the Cleveland Indians, who lost their third straight to Boston 4-2.

Salem pounded three Wenatchee pitchers for 15 hits Thursday night and handed the Northwest League leaders their third straight loss, 15-4.

Spokane goes to Yakima for a four-game series starting Friday night, while Lewiston plays at Wenatchee and Tri-City at Salem.
