Great Circle Air Route Application Shelved

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Civil Aeronautics Board decided here that it will shelve Pan American World Airways' application for authority to fly the "great circle" northern route to the Orient.

The CAB, in rejecting a petition by Northwest Orient Airlines, ruled that no action is warranted at this time on the Pan American-great circle route question.

The CAB last February, acting on President Eisenhower's instructions, approved extension of Northwest's Seattle-Portland-Anchorage-Tokyo route for seven years. Pan American's application for a great circle route matching Northwest's was deferred pending further study and later reports on the "economic and technical feasibility and the military and foreign policy implications of nonstop service between the West Coast and the Orient."
