

Authority Asked For Europe Flight

WASHINGTON — Trans World Airlines has asked the Civil Aeronautics Board here for authority to fly directly from the U. S. West Coast to Europe.

TWA officials said that under the proposal their planes "may or may not fly a so-called polar route, but will be free to choose the most advantageous high latitude course depending upon winds and pressure pattern."

TWA proposed to accomplish this by the designation of Los Angeles, San Francisco, Oakland, Portland and Seattle as co-terminals on its international routes.

TWA said the addition of West Coast co-terminals would permit the use of the shortest, most direct course between the Pacific Coast and London and Paris. The Scandinavian Airlines System and Canadian Pacific Airlines have inaugurated polar flights between the West Coast and Europe.

Also announced by the A.L.C. were plans for new churches in Washington's Columbia Basin area. New Churches at Othello, Soap Lake, Port Orford, Ore., and Hephner, Ore., were accepted for membership into the district.
