The Solons got three runs in the second inning of the opener thanks to the wildness of pitcher Bob Alexander who gave up a single, three walks, hit a batter and errored.

John Marshall limited Lewiston to four hits in posting his fifth victory in the first game at Wenatchee. The Chiefs won in the fifth on Jerry Zavela's solo home run.

Wenatchee scored four runs in the first inning of the afterpiece. The Braves, who had scored a single run their first time up, tied the game in the second on Bob Williams' bases-loaded double, and pulled ahead with a singleton in the third. But the Chiefs popped for two runs in both the third and fourth frames and put the game out of reach with a 5-run sixth inning.

The Salem-Tri-City nightcap was scheduled for seven innings but went eight before the Senators ousted it out of the fire. Tri-City's Wayne Patrick walked in the winning run after relieving Dick Green who had loaded the bases with a bunt, an error and a walk. Jack Steinage's two-run homer in the sixth sent the game into overtime.

Salem spanked two Tri-City pitchers for 15 hits in winning the opener. Mel Krause and Tommy Agosta led the attack with four hits apiece.

# Winner-Take-All Contest Looms For Swaps, Nashua

INGLEWOOD, Calif. (AP) — Racing fans and the Hollywood Race Track management awaited word today from the East on an invitation for Nashua to run against California's Swaps in a \$100,000 winner-take-all duel here this summer.

The two, America's finest 3-year-old thoroughbreds, propelled themselves into a possible match race two days ago when:

Nashua captured the \$119,800 Belmont Stakes in New York by nine lengths. With his Preakness triumph, it gave the big colt two thirds of the triple crown honors. Swaps won the rich Californian against older handicap stars and set a world record of 1:46.4 for a mile and one sixteenth doing it.

The California colt had taken the first jewel in the triple crown with a victory over Nashua in the Kentucky Derby, the only time they met.

Swaps' owner, ex-cowpoke Rex C. Ellsworth, yesterday disclosed that negotiations are actually under way for a match race with Nashua, with Hollywood Park the scene and the date left up to Nashua's owner William Woodward Jr. of New York.

The two would race here at a mile and one quarter at 126 pounds, under Derby conditions.

# Kameroff Dumps Tom Martindale

Ivan (Killer) Kameroff gave Tiger Tom Martindale a one-fall edge Saturday night at the army and then used his hangman's hold twice in a row to win a professional wrestling main event.

Martindale made it appear he was on his way to a fast win as he rushed into the ring to level Kameroff in 45 seconds as the match started. He dumped the Russian with a body slam and a press.

But Kameroff made it clear he had been caught unawares. He bounced back in six minutes of the second fall to even the match with a drop kick and Langman's hold.

Less than three minutes later, he won the match with another hangman's hold.

In the cleanly-fought semifinal Bill Fletcher and John Arjon each won falls before time ran out for a draw. Fletcher took the first fall with a cradle pin hold in 14:30. About 10 minutes after the second fall action started, Arjon turned the tables to stop Fletcher with the same hold.

Georges Dusette proved he was still master of the full Nelson in the special event by taking the only fall from Thor Hagan of Minneapolis, Min., with his favorite hold.

Both are solid on the sensational 20-year-old outfielder of the Detroit Tigers, who leads the league with a solid .383 average and shows no signs of letting up.

"The kid is a great hitter right now," said Williams, the 36-year-old outfielder of the Boston Red Sox.

"I think he'll win the batting title — unless his teammate Harvey Kuenn beats him out," Williams said yesterday after the Red Sox and Tigers were rained out.

"Kaline is quick with his bat — real quick. He can whip it around in a wink. That's why he's such a good hitter."

"And," Williams added, "he's going to get better."
