Body Of Cyclist Sent To Aberdeen

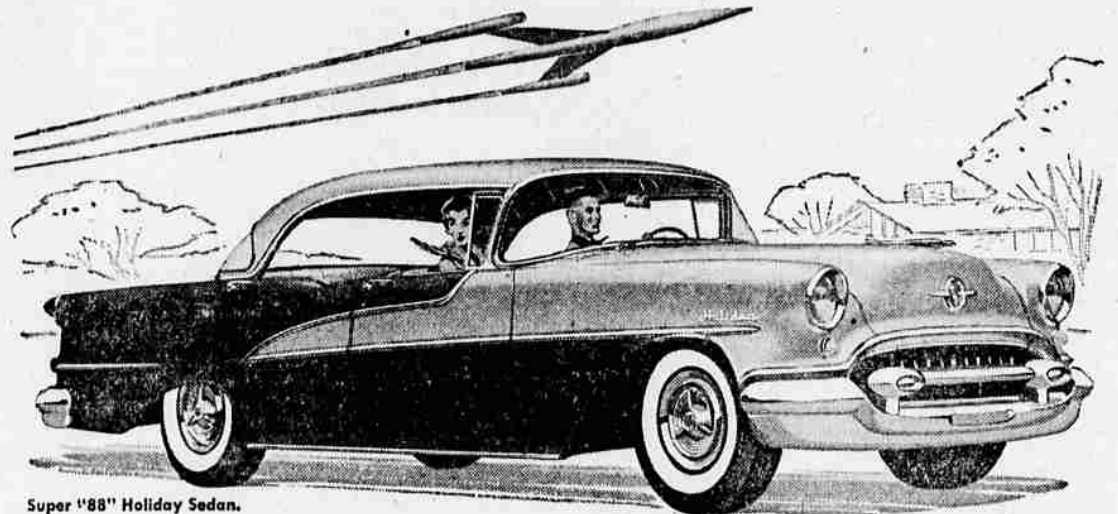
The body of George Joe Batinovich, killed instantly in a truck-motorcycle collision Friday evening has been taken to Aberdeen, Wash., for burial.

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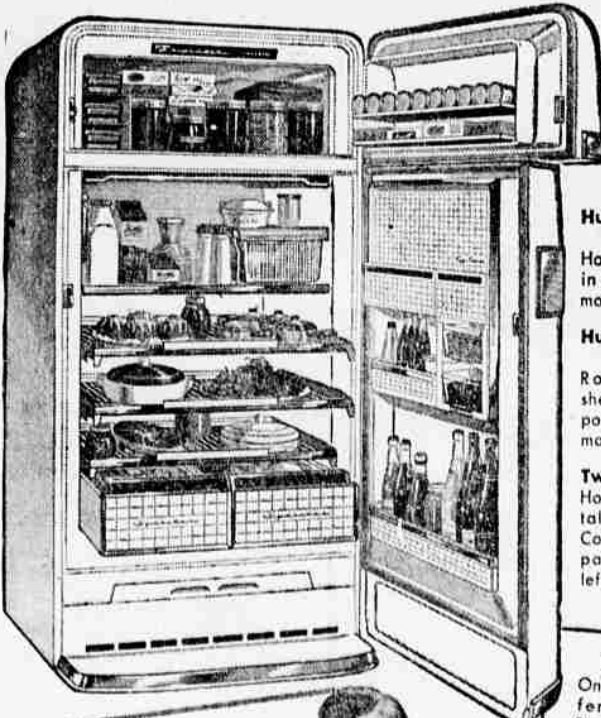
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
