

Eisenhower, Adenauer Say Germany Can't Be Neutral

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower and west German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer formally declared Tuesday that "the concept of neutrality" cannot be applied to Germany.

The President and the chancellor issued a joint statement after a half-hour White House conference. It spoke throughout of agreement between the two heads of government in the whole field of relations between the Soviet Union and Germany, and the Soviets and the West generally.

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Visit To Shrine Doesn't Save Boy

NEW YORK — A helplessly crippled boy who had been taken to the shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes in France in hope of relief from his ailment died Monday on a plane coming home.

"We found our answer," said the child's mother, Mrs. William H. Kreek of Levittown, N. Y. "The Blessed Mother thought that this was best."

The 10-year-old youngster, Billy, had suffered from cerebral palsy since birth, and had been totally incapacitated. The disease affects muscular control of the body.

His parents last Monday flew him to the French shrine, famed for the miraculous cures reported to have occurred there, "to ask the Blessed Mother to help him."

Funeral Services Held For 79 Racing Victims

LE MANS, France (AP) — Bells of all Le Mans churches tolled Tuesday while funeral rites for 79 victims of automobile racing's greatest accident were conducted in the town's 800-year-old cathedral.

The mass for the dead was said by the Rev. Jean Lelievre. He witnessed the crash Saturday at a 24-hour sports car race in which a driver and 78 spectators perished. Their bodies were represented symbolically by a catafalque covered with flowers.

The French government has banned auto racing throughout France until a new safety code for the speed tracks can be formulated. The new regulations are expected to be prepared before the next major race, the Grand Prix de Reims, set for July 2.

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
