Industrial Leader Hits At Guaranteed Wage

CHICAGO (M) - An industrial leader Wednesday said "a real guarantee of annual wages" would boost prices and "weaken industry's ability to provide more and better jobs."

That opinion was expressed by Dr. Robert E. Wilson, chairman of Standard Oil Co. of Indiana. He was the first speaker at a day-long conference "on America's economic crisis—the guaran-

teed annual wage." The meeting was so labeled by the sponsors, the National Assn. of Manufacturers and the Illinois Manufacturers Assn.

The one-day session brought together businessmen and industrialists to consider what they should do about labor's growing demand for guaranteed wage plans.
