Hammarckjold Expects Release Of Americans

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. — Secretary General Dag Hammarckjold hinted this week he expects the early release of 11 United States prisoners in Communist China.

Hammarckjold was asked at a news conference if he thought visits to the prisoners from their families would be useful in his efforts to get the men out. He said he did not, and explained he thought the visits "would not be useful because a solution would be reached in time to render them unnecessary."

He would not say how soon he expected a solution.
