Heavy Demand For New Homes Seen By Banker

PORTLAND, Ore. — A Portland banker told the Douglas Fir Plywood Assn. here that he believes there will be a national demand for seven million new homes by 1960.

Speaking at the plywood association meeting in Portland, Ben H. Hazen called the housing business "America's simplest machinery for spreading prosperity."

Hazen, who is president of a savings and loan association, said the demand for that many new homes is "pretty well assured."

Hazen added that construction of that number would increase the home loan debt by 45 billion, but he said, the home owner is "king of good credit risks."

The association chose Howard B. Garrison of Coos Bay, Ore., as its new president, succeeding Eberly

Thompson of Portland. Garrison is vice-president and general manager of Evans Products Co., western division. Other officers announced at noon Monday were A. W. Agnew, Sonoma, Calif., vice-president; C. Henry Bacon, Jr., Shelton, Wash., treasurer, and Monford Orloff, Bellingham, Wash., secretary. Trustees are Martin N. Degge, Aberdeen, Wash.; Fay L. Foval, Longview, Wash.; Corydon Wagner, Sr., Tacoma; and Robert N. Kelly, of Portland.

Man Shot Because Turtle Was In Roadside Slough

SPRINGFIELD, Ore. (AP) — A city police report said that Howard Fought, 23, was shot through the wrist Sunday because a turtle was in a roadside slough.

The report, released by Acting Chief Harold Cowles, connected these events this way:

Fought and his brother, Ray, 19, headed Sunday for the McKenzie to do some fishing. A little way out of town they saw the turtle and Ray whipped a .22 caliber pistol from his holster.

But instead of getting a shot at the turtle as he had planned, the gun discharged and the bullet went through his brother's wrist. It lodged in his thigh.
