Pupils Asked To Avoid School After Polio Shots

FRANKLIN LAKES, N.J.—Eight youngsters who received Salk antipolio vaccine shots have been asked by the Board of Education to stay away from school for the remainder of the term.

The board's action followed reports that parents of other pupils fear the inoculated children might be polio carriers.

Franklin Lakes, with 2,500 residents, had three polio cases last November, including two fatal ones. As a result, the community is especially concerned about the disease.

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Actress Denies Charges Made By Her Ex-Husband

HOLLYWOOD—Actress Maureen O'Hara has flatly denied her former husband's accusation that she has been "openly living and consorting" with a wealthy Mexican City businessman.

And, through her attorney, she added a few charges of her own. The charges against the red-haired actress were made yesterday when William H. Price, New York TV producer, filed a Superior Court affidavit in which he sought full custody of their 11-year-old daughter Bronwyn Bridgett.

In it Price said he "was informed and believes" his former wife went to Mexico City in 1953 and 1954 to see one Enrico Parra, described as a married man with two grown daughters.

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
