Youngs Bay Co. Workers' Safety Record Very High

Workers at Youngs Bay Lumber Co. in Roseburg will apparently have an outstanding record to boast about at this fall's regional industrial safety conference.

As a matter of fact, the safety committee at the plant is so proud of its record now, it has issued a challenge to any other mill in the county.

The reason for the pride is the recent award made to the company workers for the lowest frequency average of accidents for a five-year period for sawmills. The award was made this month at a Forest Products Safety Conference at Victoria, B. C. It covers mills in British Columbia, Oregon, Washington, California, Idaho and Montana.

Youngs Bay has gone into industrial safety in a big way with competitions both inside the plant and against other plants. It has the "full backing of the company in an effort to maintain interest in safety," reports Edell Bryant, secretary of the safety committee.

At the Roseburg mill, a contest is sponsored every three months by the committee among the seven departments. Workers in the winning department split a "kitty" which has been collected within the committee.

Membership of the safety committee itself is made up of foremen and workers. The workers are rotated each six months, so all can take part in safety rulings.

Bryant gives heavy credit for the success of the safety program to President Morley Houston and past presidents Calvin Stroup and George Showers, as well as company representative Roy Cummins.

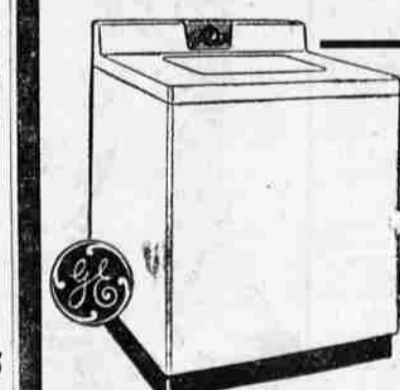

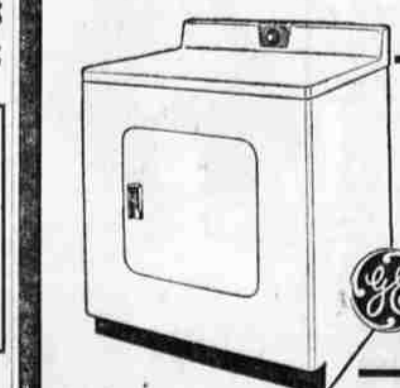
