Social Security Hearing Asked By Administration

WASHINGTON (AP) — The administration said this week a Democratic-sponsored plan to broaden social security payments needs "a thoroughgoing review and inquiry."

These were the words of Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare, Charles C. Hays, in a letter to Chairman Cooper (D-Tenn.) of the House Ways and Means Committee which began closed-door sessions on the issue Tuesday.

Republican congressional leaders also added the President's voice to the GOP clamor for public hearings on the proposed changes.

By a straight 15-10 party line vote, the Democrats overrode a Republican effort Tuesday morning to open up the question for public hearings.

Backing this "more study is needed" theme of the GOP commitment, Mrs. Hays wrote Cooper that "a thoroughgoing review and inquiry into the issues raised... are essential."

She said that the Democratic proposals would cost more than 2 billion dollars a year, having a big impact on the 21 billion dollar social security fund.

Telegrams urging public hearings were being sent to all members of the House committee by the U. S. Chamber of Commerce. The telegrams argued a gain in two Democratic proposals—to lower the retirement age for women from 65 to 62, and provide benefits for the totally disabled.

Pope Calls On Movies To Clean Up Films

VATICAN CITY (AP) — Pope Pius XII, in his first major address on motion pictures, Tuesday called upon "men of good will" in the giant industry to ban corrupt films.

The 79-year-old head of the Roman Catholic Church spoke to leaders of the industry in Italy, stars and starlets, writers and scene builders and shifters.

Together with pilgrims from various countries, including groups from France who came here for the Beatification Sunday of 39 martyrs of the French Revolution, the Pope received them in a big general audience in St. Peter's Basilica.

In all, about 10,000 persons were in the Basilica.

Hope Of Son's Freedom By Reds Elates Mother

NEW YORK (AP) — An American mother tearfully but thankfully received new hope this week that her son—who vanished behind the Iron Curtain years ago—is still alive, though in a Russian prison camp.

"Oh my God...could it be?" cried Mrs. May Feingersh of Brooklyn when informed of news accounts mentioning the man who may be her son, Pvt. Murray Feingersh, 36.

The news reports came from Wiener Neustadt, Austria, where a group of Austrian war prisoners and civilian internees arrived after being released from a Russian camp in Siberia.

The returnees reported that they had met in the camp an American whose name they gave as "Mike Feingersh."

"That's my son," exclaimed Mrs. Feingersh, amid sobs. Nearly collapsing from emotion, the mother said her son was listed by the Army as a deserter while stationed in Germany.
